SECTION - I

GENERAL :

PLATINUM JUBILEE YEAR (1930 – 2005)

In India, the first provincial Public Service Commission was established in 1930 in the Madras Province as per the Lee Commission Report (Government of India Act 1919) and the Madras Legislature Council passed the Madras Act No. XI of 1929. The then Commission consisted of a Chairman and two Members. In 1936 the name was modified as "The Madras Public Service Commission" and in 1970 the name of the Public service Commission was changed to "Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission".

Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission completed its 75th Year in 2005 during which its Platinum Jubilee was celebrated. **His Excellency the President of India Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam** sent his greetings message for the function. **Hon'ble Prime Minister of India Dr. Manmohan Singh and His Excellency the Governor of Tamil Nadu, Thiru. Surjit Singh Barnala** also sent their greetings for the success of the function. **The Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu, Dr. Selvi J. Jayalithaa**, presided over the function in the presence of the Full Commission. The Platinum Jubilee souvenir was released on the occasion. In addition, prizes were distributed to the winners who participated in the cultural programme, sports events, and other competitive events. Mementos were handed over to the Hon'ble ex-Chairmen, Members and retired Personnel of Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission who had completed 75 years of age.

FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES

The Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission has to discharge the duties and functions specified in Article 320 of the Constitution of India. The Commission is required to advise Government on all matters relating to framing of recruitment rules, principles to be followed in making appointments and promotions and transfers from one service to another service, in respect of disciplinary matters affecting Government Servants and to conduct examinations for selection of candidates under direct recruitment to the State Subordinate and Ministerial Services. The Commission conducts Departmental Examinations for Government Servants and also conducts the examination on behalf of the Government of India, Ministry of Defence, for admission to the school run by the Rashtriya Indian Military College, Dehra Dun.

10. REFORMS AND RATIONALIZATION

The Commission is continuously engaged in reviewing its selection process taking into consideration the latest developments in organisations similar to Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission engaged in recruitment work.

SECTION - II

DIRECT RECRUITMENT:

During the period, the Commission finalised 2 recruitments containing 24 vacancies and recommended 24 candidates for appointments. The recruitment statistics in respect of 2 recruitments are given in the Annexure - II.

MAIN WRITTEN EXAMINATION:

During the period under report, the Commission conducted 4 Main Written Examinations to fill up 2418 vacancies. 3,63,197 candidates were admitted to these Main Written Examinations.

ORAL EXAMINATION:

During the period under report, the Commission conducted Oral Test for 4 Recruitments to fill up 1850 vacancies. The Commission conducted interviews on 37 days. The Oral Tests were held in two sessions, one in the F.N. and the other in the A.N., a maximum of 6 Boards were constituted in both the sessions on some days, 3075 candidates were admitted to Oral Test. Totally 420 sessions took place in 37 days for the current year.

5. CONCURRENCE UNDER RULES 20(a) (iii) OF THE SPECIAL RULES FOR THE TAMIL NADU MINISTERIAL SERVICE.

The Commission accorded its consent under the provision in Rule 20(a)(iii) of the Special Rules of Tamil Nadu Ministerial Services for the permanent transfer of 87 personnel from one departmental unit to another departmental unit within the Tamil Nadu Ministerial Service and in no case, consent was refused.

6. PROMULGATION AND AMENDMENTS:

During the period under report, there were 52 cases of issue of statutory rules or amendments to them by the Government. Of them, in respect of 51 cases, the Commission was consulted before the rules were issued and in 1 case, the Commission was not consulted. However, this case relates either to post excluded from the purview of the Commission or to matters in respect of which under Article 320(3) of the Constitution of India, in which consultation with the Commission is not necessary.

7. RELAXATION:

During the period under report, there is no case in which statutory rules relating to age and educational qualifications as the case may be, were relaxed by the Government.

SECTION - V**OTHER THAN RECRUITMENT EXAMINATIONS****I. DEPARTMENTAL EXAMINATION:**

Departmental Tests were conducted in May and December 2005. The total number of tests conducted was 215 and the number of candidates applied to the tests was 80,832.

II. HALF YEARLY EXAMINATION:

35 and 55 candidates appeared in September 2005 and March 2006 respectively. Half Yearly Examination including First Class Language Test in Tamil was conducted for Officers of Indian Administrative Service, Indian Police Service, Indian Forest Service and State services.

III. RASHTRIYA INDIAN MILITARY COLLEGE SCHOOL, DEHRA DUN EXAMINATION:

The Commission conducted the Examination on behalf of the Government of India, Ministry of Defence in August 2005 and in February 2006 for selection of candidates for admission to Rashtriya Indian Military College School in Dehra Dun. 138 and 130 candidates respectively appeared for the examination.

SECTION - VI**Government and the Commission****A. NON ACCEPTANCE OF COMMISSION'S ADVICE:**

During the year under report, the Government have deviated from the Commission's advice in three cases. The details are as follows:

Case -I

(G.O.2(D) No.54, Home (SC) Department, dated 16.2.2005)

During September 2001, the Government had sought the views of the Commission as to the orders to be passed on the disciplinary action initiated against Thiru. N. Namasivayam, formerly Deputy Director of Fire & Rescue Services, Coimbatore for the substantiated allegation of demand

and acceptance of bribe. The Commission, after examining the case in detail, in its letter dated 29.9.2003 offered its views as follows:-

"The observation of Commissioner for Disciplinary proceedings on this aspect which is available at p.62 of the Commissioner for Disciplinary proceedings report is just and correct and therefore there is no need to deviate from the findings of the Commissioner for Disciplinary proceedings that charge is proved based on the theory of preponderance of probability. The Commission, therefore concludes that both the charges framed against the delinquent Officer are proved and finds no reason to deviate from the punishment proposed by the Government, i.e. Compulsory retirement on delinquent Officer with full compensatory pension and gratuity as eligible on the date of compulsory retirement under pension Rule 39(1)".

The Government have now issued orders imposing the punishment of compulsory retirement from service on Thiru. N. Namasivayam and granting him only 2/3rd of his eligible pension, as granting full pension and gratuity would nullify the impact of the compulsory retirement. Therefore, the Government issued orders deviating from the views of the Commission.

Case -2

(G.O. 3(D) No.44, Home (Prison I) Department, Dated 28.4.2005)

In the case relating to the disciplinary action against Thiru. K. Vidyasagar, Deputy Inspector General of Prisons on charges of misappropriating wealth disproportionate to his known sources of income, the Government arrived at a provisional conclusion to impose a punishment of cut in pension of Rs.100/- per month for a period of one year and sought the views of the Commission in October 1993.

The Commission advised the Government to exonerate the Delinquent Officer from the charges on benefit of doubt. But the Government replied that the benefit of doubt would apply to criminal cases and that the preponderance of probability would apply to departmental cases and sought revised views of the Commission in November 1996. The Commission then advised the Government to impose the punishment of cut in pension Rs.250/- per month permanently for life instead of Rs.100/- per month for one year on the Delinquent Officer as was proposed in the show-cause notice.

Thereafter the Government stated that the case of the Delinquent Officer did not relate to any pecuniary loss, to Government and as such the punishment of recovery of an indefinite amount as suggested by the Commission was not admissible under pension rules and that the punishment of cut in pension of Rs.100/- per month for a period of one year alone could be imposed as the highest punishment and therefore again sought for the revised views of the Commission.

But the Commission in its views dated 19.9.2001 stated that the Government's opinion viz the punishment of cut in pension would be made permanently only in cases where a pecuniary loss to Government is involved was incorrect. Hence the Commission reiterated its earlier views and advised the Government in September 2001 to issue a revised show-cause notice to the Delinquent Officer as to why the punishment of cut in pension of Rs.250/- should not be imposed permanently for life and to proceed further after getting his reply.

The Government have issued orders in G.O. 3(D) No.44 Home (Prison I) Department dated 28.4.05 deviating from the Commission's advice and have imposed the punishment of cut in pension of Rs.250/- per month for 3 years on the Delinquent Officer for the proven charges.

The Commission advised the Government to impose the punishment of cut in pension of Rs.250/- per month permanently for life. But the Government have issued orders deviating from the Commission's advice.

Case -3**(G.O. 2(D) No.487, Home (SC) Department, dated 9.11.05**

In June 2005, the Government sought the views of the Commission as to the orders to be passed on the Review Petition preferred by Thiru.K. Premkumar, Superintendent of Police against the punishment of stoppage of increment for two years with cumulative effect imposed on him by the Government for the charges that he had absconded from the Court Proceedings which resulted in the issuance of Non-Bailable warrants against him and for having adopted dilatory tactics causing abnormal delay in conducting the trial in SC No.169/83 before the III Additional Assistant Sessions Court, Madurai and for having made incorrect and false statements in the C.O.P.No.6693/2000 filed by him to quash the proceedings in SC No.169/1983 pending before III Additional Assistant Sessions Judge, Madurai, and for having misled the Hon'ble High Court of Madras and committed perjury, which resulted in passing of sharp adverse comments against him and imposing on him a fine of Rs.10,000/- as costs by the High Court, Madras and thereby having failed to maintain absolute integrity, devotion to duty and acted in a manner of unbecoming of a member of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services and thus contravening Rule 20(1) of the Tamil Nadu Government servants conduct Rules, 1973. The Commission after examining the case in detail in its letter dated 18.10.2005 observed that the Review Petitioner has not put forth any valid points to be considered as worthy for consideration and that the Review Petitioner who is the custodian of law has taken the law in his hand and played a brutal role in this case since the Government had already taken a very lenient view by awarding a lesser punishment the Commission advised the Government to reject the review petition of the Review Petitioner.

However, the Government have issued orders setting aside the punishment of stoppage of increment for two years with cumulative effect imposed on the review petitioner in deviation from the Commission's advice.

Considering the gravity of the delinquencies committed by the review petitioner, the Commission advised the Government to reject his review petition. But the Government have issued orders deviating from the Commission's advice.

B. NON-CONSULTATION WITH THE COMMISSION:

During the year under report, the Government did not consult the Commission in one case. The detail is as follows :-

Case-1

(G.O.Ms.No.337/Finance (Co-operative Audit) Department, dt. 08.09.2005).

The post of Junior Co-operative Auditor in the Directorate of Co-operative Audit is governed by the Adhoc rules issued in G.O.Ms.No.253, Finance (Co-operative Audit), dt. 31.03.86 with reference to Rule 3 (d) of the said rules, the vacancies in the post should be filled up as follows:-

"Ten percent of the permanent vacancies in the post of Junior Co-operative Auditor shall be filled up by recruitment by transfer and out of these ten percent of the vacancies, six percent shall be reserved for Junior Assistant, three percent for Typist and one percent for Steno-Typist Grade-III. The remaining ninety percent of the vacancies shall be filled up by direct recruitment".

The Government have issued orders in G.O. Ms.No.337, Finance (Co-operative Audit), Dept. dated 8.9.2005, that rule 3 (d) of the adhoc rules for the post of Junior Co-operative Auditor in the Tamil Nadu Co-operative subordinate Service be relaxed as one time measure for the panel due on 1.10.2004 only in order to fill up the vacancies of Junior Co-operative Auditor in the

Department of Co-operative Audit by recruitment by transfer and that this order will cease to exist after this panel is approved.

The Commission should have been consulted before any decision affecting the methods of appointment or principles followed in making appointment to posts within its purview is taken. But the Commission was not consulted before the issue of orders in the above said. G.O. The Government were therefore requested to state the reason for not obtaining the Commission's concurrence before the issue of the orders.

The Government have stated that despite the fact, that the concurrence of the Commission is required in this case, it was left by oversight and that this may result in embarrassment to the Commission which may be regretted, that this kind of occurrence will not happen in future, and that Commission's concurrence be obtained wherever necessary.

C. Details of the number of cases in which the Government have not accepted the Commission's advice and the number of cases in which Government have not consulted the Commission are given for the latest five years in Annexure - XII.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

The Commission records its appreciation for the co-operation extended by various educational Institutions and their officers in the matter of providing suitable accommodation for the various examinations held by the Commission.

The Commission is also grateful to the examiners and experts who, inspite of their personal inconvenience, readily accepted the Commission's invitation and assisted them in the conduct of different examinations and selection of officers to various posts under the State Government.

The Commission expresses its sincere thanks to all the Secretaries to Government and Heads of Departments for their kind co-operation in finalising the selection of candidates for appointment by recruitment by transfer/promotion through the Departmental Promotion Committees.

In conclusion, the Commission also places on record its appreciation of the Co-operation and efforts of the personnel in the smooth functioning of the Commission.

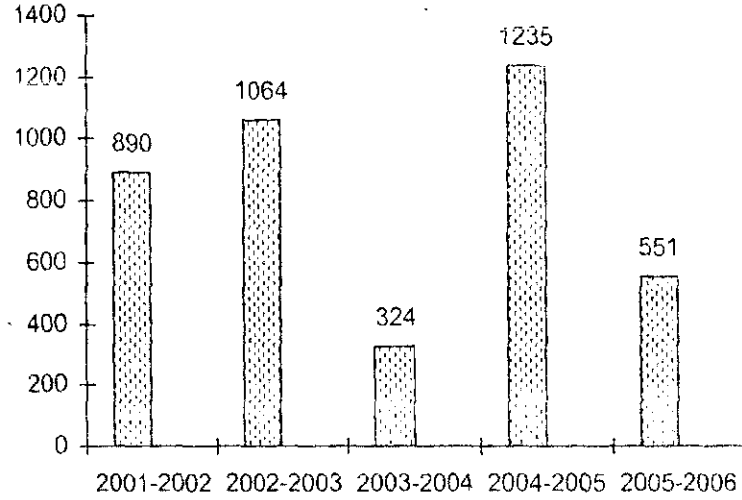

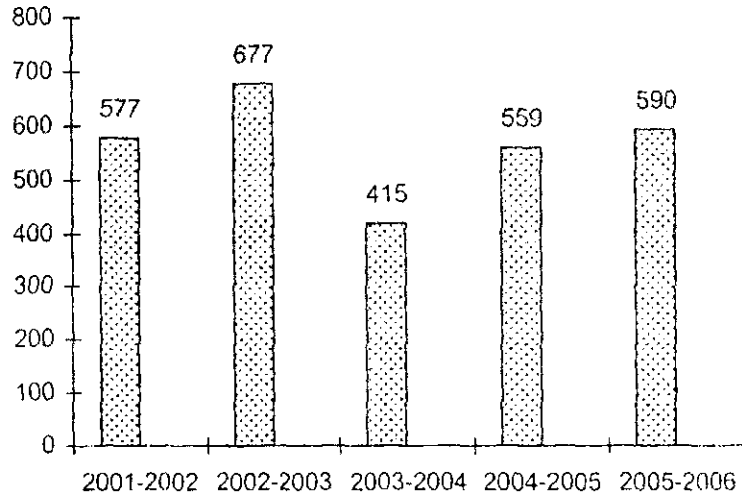
