- (a) 'A' causes cattle to enter upon a field belonging to 'Z' intending to cause and knowing that he is likely to cause damage to Z's crop. What is the offence committed by 'A'?
- (b) 'A' threatens to publish a defamatory libel concerning 'Z' unless 'Z' gives him money. He thus induces 'Z' to give him money. State the nature of offence
- (c) 'A' commits house trespass by entering 'B's house through window. Is 'A' guilty of any offence?
- (d) 'Z' dictates his will to 'A'. 'A' intentionally writes down a different legatee from the legatee named by 'Z' and by representing to 'Z' that he has prepared the will according to his instructions, induces 'Z' to sign the will. Is 'A' guilty of any offence?
- (e) 'A' for the purpose of inducing 'B' to desist from prosecuting a civil suit, threatens to burn 'B's house. Has 'A' committed any offence?
- (f) 'A' makes an attempt to pick the pocket of 'Z' by thrusting his hand into 'Z' pocket. 'A' fails in the attempt in consequence of Z's having nothing in his pocket. Is 'A' guilty of any offence.
- (g) 'A' shoots 'C' with the intention of killing him. 'C' dies in consequence. Is 'A' guilty of any offence?
- (h) 'A' shakes his fist at 'Z' intending or knowing it to be likely that he may thereby cause 'Z' to believe that 'A' is about to strike 'Z'. Has 'A' committed any offence?
- (i) 'A' a carrier, is entrusted by 'Z' with property to be carried by land or by water. 'A' dishonestly misappropriates the property. State the nature of offence.
