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**INTRODUCTION :**

## SECTION—I.

### FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES :

Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission have to discharge the duties and functions specified in the Article 320 of the Constitution. The Commission are required to advise Government on all matters relating to framing of recruitment rules principles to be followed in making appointments, promotions and transfer from one service to another service, in respect of disciplinary matters effecting Government Servants and to make direct recruitment to the State. Subordinate and Ministerial Services. The Commission conducts Special and Departmental examinations for Government Servants and also conducts the examination on behalf of the Government of India, Ministry of Defence for admission to Rashtriya Indian Military College, Dhera Dun.

**IX. NOTIFICATION—**

The Commission advertised 36 notifications comprising 1,068 vacancies in 44 posts under different services of the state. (For details see Annexure-IV).

**X. REFORMS AND RATIONALISATION —**

The Commission are continuously engaged in reviewing its selection processes taking into consideration the latest developments in organisations similar to Tamil Nadu Public Services Commission engaged in recruitment work.

**SECTION—II.****DIRECT RECRUITMENT :**

The Commission Selected and recommended the candidates to fill up 908 vacancies in 32 categories of posts—14 in State Services and 18 in Subordinate Services. For 908 vacancies 13,658 applications were received, 7,517 were admitted to main written examination and 1984 were admitted to oral examination. Out of 1984 908 were finally selected. Some of the major recruitments handled in the year are:

## TECHNICAL POSTS : SELECTION PROCESS.

*Veterinary Assistant. Surgeon.*—The Commission issued notification on 9th July 1990 inviting application for appointment to 200 vacancies. 234 applications were received. The oral examination will be held in the month of July.

*Assistant Surgeon.*—The Commission issued notification on 29th November 1990 inviting applications for appointment to 575 vacancies. 5,208 applications were received. The main written examination was held on 31st March 1991.

## DISTRICT MUNSIF :

The Commission issued notification on 5th November 1990 inviting application for appointment to 83 vacancies. 2,051 applications were received. The oral examination was held from 7th March 1991 to 20th April 1991 and 83 were selected for appointment.

## GROUP SERVICES.

### GROUP—I SERVICES :

In Group—I Services, 550 candidates were admitted to main written examination. The main written examination was held from 6th October 1990 to 11th October 1990. On the basis of performance in the written examination, 104 candidates were admitted to oral examination which was held from 25th April 1991 to 29th April 1991.

The Commission issued notification for special recruitment exclusively for S.C./S.T community candidates for appointment as Deputy Collectors included in Group—I Services on 6th February 1991. 5450 applications have been received. The Preliminary examination will be held on 23rd June 1991.

### GROUP—II SERVICES :

65,000 candidates applied to the preliminary examination which was held on 24th June 1990. 820 candidates were admitted to main written examination which was held on 22nd February 1991. On the basis of main written examination 164 candidates have been admitted to oral examination. The oral test will be held in the month of June 1991.

### GROUP—III SERVICES :

82,604 candidates applied for the preliminary examination which was held on 23rd June 1990. 690 were admitted to main written examination which was held on 28th December 1990. On the basis of main written examination, 138 have been admitted to the oral examination. The oral test is proposed to be held in the month of June 1991.

### GROUP—V SERVICES :

The Commission issued notification on 15th October 1990 inviting applications for appointment to 12 vacancies in Group—V Services. 8,741 applications were received. The preliminary examination was held on 28th March 1991.

### GROUP—V-A SERVICES :

The Commission issued notification on 30th October 1990 inviting applications for appointment to 66 vacancies for the Post of Assistant in Tamil Nadu Secretariat Service by transfer of Junior Assistants in other departments. 55 applications have been received. Due to lesser number of applications received, the Government have been directed to relax the age and service conditions for admission to this selection.

**GROUP—VII SERVICES :**

5,028 candidates applied for the preliminary examination which was held on 7th April 1990. 129 were admitted to main written examination which was held on 23rd March 1991. On the basis of main written examination 36 have been admitted to oral examination. The oral test is proposed to be held in the month of June 1991.

**GROUP—VIII SERVICES :**

12,030 candidates applied to the Preliminary examination which was held on 31st March 1990. 300 were admitted to main written examination which was held on 28th October 1990. 60 were admitted to oral examination. The oral test is proposed to be held in the month of July 1991.

**GROUP—IX SERVICES :**

3,709 candidates applied to the Preliminary examination which was held on 8th April 1990. 50 were admitted to main written examination which was held on 6th May 1991.

**GROUP—X SERVICES :**

The Commission issued notification on 17th September 1990 inviting applications for appointment to 7 vacancies in Group X Services. 8,516 applications were received. The preliminary examination was held on 28th March 1991.

*Preliminary Examination*.—During the period under report the Commission conducted 7 preliminary recruitment examinations consisting 148 vacancies. 1,46,732 candidates applied to those 7 recruitment examinations.

*Main Examination*.—During the period under report the Commission conducted 26 main written examination to fill up 1,528 vacancies 15,257 candidates were admitted to those main written examination held in 1990—91. The details of Preliminary and Main examination are given in Annexure-V.

**PAUCITY OF QUALIFIED AND SUITABLE CANDIDATES FOR CERTAIN CATEGORIES OF POSTS.**

There were paucity of qualified and suitable candidates for certain categories of posts like Assistant Engineer (Electrical)—4 Accounts Officers, Grade-III—1 and Research Officer Evaluation and Applied Research Department—2. Thus a total of 7 vacancies (SC/ST—6 Open Competition—1) could not be filled up during this year, the details of which are given in Annexure-VI.

**SECTION—III.**

*Commissionsittings*.—The Commission apart from the informal meetings sat for interview on 78 days. The oral tests were held in two sessions one in the F.N. and the other in the A.N. Maximum of 4 boards sat in both sessions. 511 total sessions took place in the current year. The details are given below:—

### 3. STATUTORY RULES, REGULATION ETC.

In 551 cases, the Commission's concurrence was sought for and given under the latter part of Regulation 16 (b) of the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission Regulation 1954 for making appointments to the posts in the state and subordinate services. In 13 cases the Commission refused to accord such concurrence.

### 4. TEMPORARY APPOINTMENTS,

The Commission accorded its concurrence for the continuance of temporary appointments in different posts included in Tamil Nadu State/Subordinate/Ministerial services beyond the periods of 24 months in 526 cases and more than 24 months in 466 cases.

### 5. CONCURRENCE UNDER RULE 20(a) (iii) OF THE SPECIAL RULES FOR THE TAMIL NADU MINISTERIAL SERVICES.

The Commission accorded its consent under the provision in Rule 20(a) (iii) of the Special Rules for the Tamil Nadu Ministerial Service for the permanent transfer of 289 personnel from one department unit to another departmental unit in the Tamil Nadu Ministerial Services.

## 6. PROMULGATION AND AMENDMENTS.

During the period under report, there were 274 cases of issue of Statutory Rules or amendments to them by the Government of them, in respect of 244 cases, the Commission was consulted, before the rules were issued and in 34 cases the Commission was not consulted. However those cases relate either to post, excluded from the purview of the Commission or to matters in respect of which under article 320 (3) of the Constitution of India consultation with the commission was not necessary.

## 7. RELAXATION.

During the period under report, there were 99 cases in which statutory rules relating to age and/or educational qualifications, as the case may be were relaxed by the Government.

In 6 cases, orders of relaxation were issued by the Government in respect of Pension matter. In 25 cases, orders of relaxation were issued in respect of certain provisions of the Fundamental Rules Tamil Nadu Special Pay and Allowances Rules and the Tamil Nadu Travelling Allowance Rules. In 142 cases, orders of relaxation was issued by the Government in respect of certain provisions of the General Provident Fund (Madras) Rules.

### SECTION—V.

## OTHER THAN RECRUITMENT EXAMINATIONS.

### 1. Special and Departmental Examinations.

The Special and Departmental tests were conducted in May and November 1990. The total number of tests conducted were 274 and the number of candidates, appeared in the tests were 94,539. The details are given below :—

### 11. Half-Yearly Examination :

45 and 50 candidates respectively appeared in the September 1990 and March 1991, Half-Yearly Examinations and Language Tests held for Assistant Collectors Deputy Collectors, Police Officers and Forest Officers.

III. The Commission issued Notification inviting applications for proficiency test in Tamil for I.A.S., I.P.S., and I.F.S., Officers whose mother tongue is not Tamil held in July. Five candidates applied and none of them appeared in the examination.

The Commission conducted the examination on behalf of the Government of India, Ministry of Defence in August 1990 for selection of candidates for admission to Rashtriya Indian Military College, Dehra Duns. Out of the 73 candidates appeared for the examination one candidate was selected. The examination was also conducted in February 1991. 97 candidates appeared and the results are awaited.

## SECTION—VI.

## REFORMS AND RATIONALISATION.

**(i) Oral Test: Single Mark Awarded :**

Formerly it was the practice to award separated marks to different posts/services included in the same Group Services examination. Now the Commission awards a single mark for Group of Services as whole and allotment is made to different posts/services as per the marks score/ranking and option exercised by the candidates.

**(ii) Marks in Oral Examination :**

The Commission have fixed the oral examination marks at 12.2 per cent of the total marks for any recruitment and also have fixed the minimum/maximum marks that are awardable. The Commission have also divided this awardable mark range into 10 gradations and the candidates have to be assessed and graded into one among the 10 gradations.

**(iii) Number of Applicants to Oral :**

Whenever the number of vacancies is 4 or less in any community class component, candidates exactly 3 times the number of vacancies in all class components will be admitted to the oral test and when the number of vacancies is 5 or more, candidates exactly 2 times the number of vacancies will be admitted to the oral test.

**(iv) Application Format—Avertised :**

The Commission gives the format of the application forms in its advertisements: in newspapers for preliminary examinations and the candidates are asked to apply in the given format.

**(v) Through proper channel :**

Candidates' Applications need not be forwarded through their employers. It is enough if they have certified in the declaration that they have informed their employer in writing of their applying to the competitive examination. They should produce a No Objection Certificate at the time of main written/oral examination.

**(vi) Objective Type Tests :**

The preliminary examination will consist of 200 objective type questions in General Knowledge with 100 marks and 2 hours time duration.

**(vii) Syllabus Formulation :**

The Commission have framed syllabi in 172 subjects in four educational standards—viz., Post Graduate Degree, Bachelor's degree, Higher Secondary and Diploma Standard—for the competitive examinations. Besides the copies of syllabi are supplied to the applicants along with application forms.

**(viii) Combined Services Examination ;**

The Commission have proposed to conduct combined services examination by combining different posts/services for which the educational qualifications prescribed are the same or similar. In this regard, the Commission have written to Government for merger of certain group services examinations and proposals in technical posts have been put up for Commission's approval.

**(ix) Computerisation;**

The computer system installed in the office is being utilised for preparation of hall tickets, allocation of candidates to different examination halls, centre tabulation, ranking and selection of eligible candidate after the evaluation of answer books.



## SECTION—VII.

## GOVERNMENT AND THE COMMISSION

**Non-Acceptance of Commission's Advice.**

During the year under report the Government have deviated from the commission's advice in 14 cases. The Government have violated in those 14 cases the well established convention that the Commission's advice must be accepted in all cases except where matters of policy are involved or where imperative reasons exist for not accepting the Commission's advice.

Similarly the commission was not consulted in 3 cases wherein it should have been consulted before the issue of executive orders on Special Rules/Ad-Hoc-Rules. Thus the Government have violated their own instructions and the Commission trusted that this will not recur.

The details of the number of cases in which the Government have not accepted the Commission's advice the Government have not consulted the Commission are given for the latest five years in Annexure-XI.

**A. Instances of Deviation by the Government from the Commission's Advice.****1. G.O. Ms. No. 2038, Health and Family Welfare dated 28th October 1987.**

In July 1985, the Government sought for the Commission's views on the disciplinary action taken against a Tutor in Medicine, Madurai Medical College for his unauthorised absence from duty from 5th August 1980 to 4th November 1984. The Commission after going through the records of the case had advised to the Government that the seniority of the delinquent be reduced by ten places as a measure of punishment since the delinquent joined duty on 5th November 1984. In April 1986 the Government had again requested the Commission to offer its revised views since the delinquent again proceeded on leave from 25th February 1985 onwards and applied for leave upto 5th November 1986. The Commission had suggested that further disciplinary action may be initiated against the delinquent for his subsequent lapses. His explanation obtained and then the papers forwarded to the Commission to offer its views on the matter. But the Government have stated that the unauthorised absence of the delinquent from 5th August 1980 to 4th November 1984 and disobeyal of orders by not joining duty when he directed to do so are offence serious enough to warrant the imposition of the penalty of removal from service and that therefore they have decided to deviate from the views of the Commission and issued orders accordingly in G.O. Ms. No. 2038, Health and Family Welfare, dated 28th October 1987 removing the delinquent from service.

**2. G.O. Ms. No. 931. Health, Indian Medicine and Homeopathy and Family Welfare, dated 14th June 1990.**

During July 1979, the Government sought for the views of the Commission on the disciplinary action initiated against a Medical Officer, who left India unauthorisedly to take up an examination at Penang. The Commission while giving its advice on the case, observed that, though the guilt is proved the degree of punishment for the person who leaves for 20 days to take up an examination, Vis-a-vis a Government Servant who leaves India unauthorisedly for a few years to take up a job and that the former would deserve a lighter punishment, and advised the Government to impose a punishment of stoppage of increment for one year with cumulative effect on him to bring home the offence and to correct him. But the Government have stated that the delinquent hatched a deliberate plan to go abroad and tried to hoodwink the superior authorities and that indulgence of public servants in such tactics shall not be viewed lightly and hence, the Government have felt that such doctors who had the temerity to deceive the authorities

by producing false Medical Certificate for personal gains should not be allowed to be in public service. They have therefore decided to remove the delinquent from service deviating from the Commission's advice and issued orders accordingly.

3. G.O. Ms. No. 556, Agriculture (A.A.2) Department, dated 19th July 1990.

In April 1990 the Government sought the views of the Commission on the disciplinary action taken against an Assistant Director of Agriculture (Oil Seeds), Krishnagiri. The delinquent Officer was formerly working as Assistant Director of Agriculture (Oil Seeds) from 3rd January 1982 to 30th April 1983 at Krishnagiri in Dharmapuri District. Based on the allegation petition received during that period an enquiry was conducted and report was submitted. Based on this report in the first instance charges were framed against him under rule 17(a) of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Classification, Control and Appeal) rules. After obtaining his explanation, fresh charges were framed under rule 17(b) of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Classification, Control and Appeal) rules. After his explanation was received an enquiry was conducted. The Enquiry Officer drew up and submitted his report holding all the charges framed against him as proved. The Director of Agriculture forwarded the case with his recommendation that the punishment of stoppage of increment for two years with cumulative effect be inflicted on the delinquent. When the case was referred to the Commission the Commission advised that the above punishment be imposed on him—for the proven severe charges. The Government by deviating from the Commission's views issued orders in G. O. Ms. No. 556, Agriculture (AA2) department, dated 19th July 1990 reverting him from the post of Assistant Director of Agriculture to the lower post of Agricultural Officer (from 19th July 1990 that is the date of issue of orders to 20th July 1990) for two days.

4. G.O. Ms. No. 723, Labour and Employment, dated 25th May 1990.

In April, 1987, the Government in the Employment Services Department sought for the views of the Commission on the review petition preferred by one. District Employment Officer against the orders of the Government imposing on him the penalty of stoppage of increment for two years without cumulative effect for the proven charges of repeated disobeyal of written orders of his superior of having unnecessarily entered into a wordly duel with his colleague in the office, of having falsely signed the certificate of transfer of charge ante cating it, of having sent a circular letter to the higher officers with a copy sent to the Honourable Minister and of threatening the officers to join the agitation in violation of Government Servant Conduct Rules.

The Commission after, carefully, going through the records of the case considered that failure to issue a fresh notice under Rule 17(a) of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Classification Control and Appeal) rules obtain the explanation of the accused officer and to pass orders only thereafter before imposing a minor penalty and initiating disciplinary action under rule 17(b) of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Classification, Control and Appeal) Rules in the above case vitiated the proceedings of the case. It, therefore, advised the Government to set aside the orders of the Government imposing the penalty and to institute the proceedings afresh from the stage of flaw, stating that the delinquent Officer had admitted all the charges and that as no oral enquiry or personal hearing appeared necessary as per rules, the Government were of the view that their orders of penalty need not be set aside and accordingly in June 1988, they sought for the revised views of the Commission. The Commission however, after thoroughly examining the entire case again reiterated its earlier views as communicated in January 1988, in as much as it had been consistently advising the Government all along on similar cases on similar lines and orders were issued by the Government invariably accepted the Commission's views in almost all the cases. But the Government have now stated that the principle of giving ample opportunity to the accused officer to defend the charges had been fully complied with that since the accused officer had admitted all the charges that he was guilty and that there was no defect in the procedure followed. As such considering that the orders of the penalty already issued by them need not be set aside, the Government have issued orders rejecting the review petition preferred by the District Employment Officer in deviation of the Commission's advice.

5. G.O. Ms. No. 1261, *Health Indian Medicine and Homoeopathy and Family Welfare*, dated 10th July 1990.

In September 1989, the Government in the Health Department, sought the views of the Commission on the review petition preferred by a Non-Medical Reader in Pharmaceutical Chemistry, Macurai Medical College, Macurai against the orders of the Government imposing on him the penalty of withholding of increment for three years without cumulative effect for the proven charges of "For having not discharged the responsibility entrusted to him, that is conducting the examination without giving room for allegations and for his failure to maintain confidence and secrecy expected of him".

The Commission after carefully going through the records of the case considered that for the proved charges the punishment awarded is not excessive and therefore it advised to reject the review petition as devoid of merits. But the Government by deviating from the advice of the Commission have taken a lenient view in the matter allowing the Review Petition and issued orders cancelling the penalty of withholding of increment for three years without cumulative effect which was already awarded and warned the Review Petitioner.

6. G.O. Ms. No. 1559, *Health, Indian Medicine, Homoeopathy and Family Welfare*, dated 29th August 1990.

During July 1989, the Government sought for the views of the Commission on the Disciplinary action initiated against a Reader in Government Siddha Medical College, Palayamkottai for his prejudicial attitude towards a student during the clinical and oral examination; by making unwanted and derogatory remarks in the rough case sheet and for using abusive filthy and vulgar language in recording in the Rough case sheet Record book of certain female students and thus abusing his official profession and position and authority which is equated to God and Divinity. The Commission then observed that the delinquent officer is a perverted person and he is unfit to continue as a doctor and advised that he might be dismissed from service. The Government observed that the delinquent Officer had miserable fallen prey to his own emotions and that however, considering the service put in by him, they have decided to take a lenient view. They have accordingly deviating from the Commission's advice ordered for the imposition of a penalty of stoppage of increment for two years with cumulative effect.

7. G.O. Ms. No. 1132, *Industries (Es. II-2) Department*, dated 15th October 1990.

During May 1985, the Government sought the views of the Commission on a disciplinary action initiated against a Deputy Director of Industries and Commerce (Industrial Co-operatives) for the irregularities committed by him in the sale of coal to two private companies when he was working as Secretary in the Tamil Nadu Brick and Tile Manufacturer's Service Industrial Co-operative Society Limited Madras-30. The Commission then observed that out of the four charges framed against the accused officer charge one alone was partly proved and advised the Government to award "Censure" to the accused officer. The Government however, accepted the views of the Commission only in respect of charge 2 and held the other three charges as proved. They have also observed that the charges held proved are of very serious in nature and that an officer entrusted with the responsibility of looking after the best interests of a society and its members has acted in a manner that is not in the interest of the society or its members and issued orders imposing the punishment of reduction to the lower rank (i.e.) lower post for a period of two years exclusive of any period spent on leave in deviation of the Commission's advice. Vide G. O. Ms. No. 1132, Industries (Est. II-2), dated 15th October 1990.

8. G.O. Ms. No. 2522, *Transport department*, dated 11th June 1990.

During December, 1988, the Government sought the views of the Commission on a disciplinary action initiated against an Automobile Engineer of the Motor Vehicles Maintenance Department for having failed to join duty and continued his leave in spite of the specific orders of the Director of Motor Vehicles Maintenance Department. The Commission then observed that absence of the delinquent officer was not for a long period and that too was due

to his family problems. It has also observed that the delinquent Officer had explained the cause of his absence and that he had also resigned job and advised that the resignation of the delinquent Officer be accepted, if no other disciplinary cases are pending against him. The Government however, stated that, there are disciplinary cases pending against him one for the unauthorised removal of the scrap materials and another one for not adopting the proceedings in finalising the tender files and that he was also awarded some other punishment also previously. They have also added that though the resignation is justifiable, the official etiquette and normal procedure was not followed by the delinquent officer and that they were of the opinion that unless a deterrent punishment was given to him, he would be a very bad example to others in the department causing a lot of embarrassment and inconvenience to the administration and issued orders dismissing from service, by deviating from the Commission's advice.

9. G.O.Ms. No. 2649, 'Public Works Department, dated 10th December 1990.

In December 1989 the Government sought the views of the Commission on the Review Petition of an Assistant Engineer, Public Works Department. The Petitioner who was attached to the Investigation circle, Trichirappalli had initially applied for leave with effect from 3rd October 1985 on domestic grounds and extended the leave upto 31st October 1986. As the petitioner's leave exceeded six months a reference was made to the Police Department to find out the whereabouts of the petitioner. The Inspector General of Police (Crime Branch), Madras-4 reported that the petitioner had been to Mascoi during the leave period from April 1986 to October 1986. On a reference made to the Regional Passport office, Madras-6. It was reported that the petitioner obtained a passport to see the countries the time of applying for passport the petitioner has declared his profession as Civil Engineer (own Job). But as per the records, the petitioner has joined duty in the Public Works Department on 8th February 1964 in canals division Pollachi. As the suppression of his employment constituted a breach of Rules 20 of Tamil Nadu Government Servant Conduct Rules, the Chief Engineer, Public Works Department (General) framed three charges against the petitioner under Rule 17(b) of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Classification, Control and Appeal) Rules. The petitioner submitted his explanation. An enquiry was conducted. The Enquiry Officer drew up and submitted his report holding charges 2 and 3 as proved and charge 1 as not proved. The Chief Engineer, Public Works Department (General) forwarded the case to the Government.

The Government after examining the case with relevant records held all the three charges as proved and issued orders imposing on him the punishment of stoppage of increment for four years with cumulative effect. Against this punishment the petitioner preferred his review petition to the Government. When the case was referred to the Commission the Commission advised the punishment of stoppage of increment for four years with cumulative effect be modified into one of stoppage of increment for four years without cumulative effect and without affecting his pensionary benefits. For the proven charges the Government by deviating from the Commission's views issued orders in G.O.Ms. No. 2649, Public Works Department, dated 10th December 1990 rejecting the Review Petition.

10. G.O.Ms. No. 2656, Health Indian Medicine Homoeopathy and Family Welfare Department, dated 7th November 1989.

In June 1986 the Government sought the views of the Commission on the appeal of an office assistant working in the office of the Chief Water Analyst, Coimbatore. While the appellant was working in the office of the Chief Water Analyst, King Institute, Guindy in 1984, the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine in his proceedings dated 17th July 1984 issued orders transferring the appellant to the office of the Chief Water Analyst, Coimbatore and he was relieved on 31st July 1984. The orders were sent to the appellant on 1st August 1984. But the appellant had applied Earned Leave for ten days from 31st July 1984 and did not report for duty at the new station. The appellant extended his leave upto 2nd September 1984 and absented himself from duty from 3rd September 1984 without applying any leave. Therefore, the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine framed two charges against the appellant under Rule 17(b) of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Classification, Control and Appeal) Rules and classes for his explanation. The appellant submitted his explanation along with the filed



in questionnaire. A personal hearing was conducted. The Enquiry Officer submitted his report holding all the two charges levelled against the appellant as proved. After examining the case with relevant records the Director of Public Health, and Preventive Medicine held the two charges as proved and imposed the punishment of stoppage of increment for two years without cumulative effect. Against this, the appellant preferred an appeal to the Government. When the case was referred to the Commission, the Commission advised to set aside the punishment order stating failure to enclose a copy of Enquiry Officer's report along with the final orders vitiated the disciplinary proceedings and to issue a fresh punishment order by enclosing Enquiry Officer's report. Even for the Government's letter dated 12th September 1988, the Commission's earlier advice was insisted. The Government by deviating from the Commission's view issued orders in G.O. Ms. No. 2056, Health, Indian Medicine, Homoeopathy and Family Welfare Department dated 7th November 1989 rejecting the appeal.

11. G.O.Ms. No. 2, Handlooms, Handicrafts, Textiles and Khadi, dated 2nd January 1991.

In October 1989, the Government sought the views of the Commission on an appeal preferred by an Assistant Inspector of Sericulture, against the orders of the Director of Sericulture reverting him to the lower post of Junior Inspector of Sericulture for a period of three years. The Commission then observed that out of the 9 charges framed against the appellant, 6 charges were held proved beyond doubt, and that the punishment awarded by the Director of Sericulture might be confirmed and advised the Government to reject the appeal. The Government, however, stating that for the charges held proved the punishment awarded is severe and that they consider that the punishment of reduction to the lower post for a period of one year would meet the ends of justice and issued orders modifying the punishment of reduction to the next lower post of Junior Inspector of Sericulture for a period of three years into one of reduction to the post of Junior Inspector of Sericulture for one year by deviating the Commission advice.

12. G.O.Ms. No. 904, Municipal, Administration and Water Supply Department, dated 11th October 1990.

In December 1987, the Government sought the views of the Commission on the Appeal, of a Municipal Commissioner Shencottah (now retired). While he was working as Commissioner, Shencottah Municipality certain irregularities in the administration of Shencottah Municipality were noticed on his part. The Director of Municipal Administration framed four charges against the appellant under Rule 17 (b) of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Classification, Control and Appeal) Rules. The appellant submitted his defence statement along with the filled questionnaire. He was given a personal hearing. The appellant submitted his further statement of defence. After examining the case with relevant records, the Director of Municipal Administration dropped the charges 1, 3 and 4 as not proved and held the charge 2 as proved and for the proven charge, order were passed for stopping the appellant's increment for six months without cumulative effect. As the appellant having retired from service on 31st January 1987 Afternoon on attaining the age of superannuation he was directed to remit the monetary value of the above punishment. The appellant had remitted the amount as directed. Against this order, the appellant preferred an appeal to the Government. When the case was referred to the Commission, the Commission had pointed out that the failure to draw up a report on the personal hearing and to communicate a copy of it along with the final orders was a material defect affecting the conclusions reached by the disciplinary authority and vitiated the proceedings taken against the appellant. The Commission, therefore advised to set aside the punishment order and to continue the disciplinary proceedings under Tamil Nadu Pension Rules. Even for the Government's further reference in this matter, the Commission reiterated its earlier views. But the Government by quailing the Commission's advice given in another case issued orders by deviating the Commission's views in G.O. Ms. No. 904, Municipal Administration and Water Supply Department, dated 11th October 1990 rejecting the appeal. (In that case i.e., in the case of another Municipal Commissioner quoted by the Government though charges were framed under Rule 17 (a), of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Classification Control and Appeal) Rules, since a form of questionnaire was sent to the Accused Officer and he was asked to specify as to whether he desired for an oral enquiry or personal hearing or both, the Commission advised the Government to set aside the order and to continue the disciplinary proceedings under Tamil Nadu Pension Rules. However

Government had subsequently informed that action was initiated under Rule 17 (a) only the Commission accepted that the procedure laid down in Rule 17(a) had been followed in that case. Thus Disciplinary case cited by the Government is not similar to the case under discussion.)

13. *G.O. Ms. No. 270, Rural Development, dated 4th April 1990.*

In February 1989, the Government in the Rural Development Department sought the Commission's views on the draft order in which it was proposed to have the ratio between direct recruitment by Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission and recruitment by transfer for the post of Executive Officer, Grade-II in the Tamil Nadu Town Panchayat Subordinate Services as 1 : 3. The Commission suggested to alter the ratio as 1 : 2 between direct recruitment by Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission and recruitment by transfer instead of 1 : 3.

But the Government in G.O. Ms. No. 270, Rural Development dated 4th April 1990 issued order prescribed the ratio as 1 : 3 between direct recruitment by Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission and recruitment by transfer for the Post of Executive Officer, Grade-II in the Tamil Nadu Town Panchayat Subordinate Services.

14. *G.O. Ms. No. 1733, Education, dated 28th December 1990.*

In July 1989, the Government in the Education Department sought the concurrence of the Commission under the later part of Regulation 16(b) of the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission Regulation 1954 for the regularisation of the temporary Services of 18 temporary full time Junior professors and 7 temporary part-time Junior Professors (Subsequently, the Director of Legal Studies had stated that concurrence was required in respect of 16 full-time Junior professors and 6 part time Junior Professors). It was stated by the Government that the temporary full-time Junior Professors working in the Government Law Colleges in this state had represented that their service might be regularised as was done in the case of Assistant Professors of Government Arts Colleges and Assistant Professors of Pre-Law Courses in Government Law Colleges and that the Director of Legal Studies had recommended the case. The Commission examined the proposal in detail. The Commission regretted its inability to accord its concurrence on the ground that it is seen that few candidates appeared before the Commission in connection with the selection for appointment to the posts of full-time Junior Professor/Part-Time Junior Professors and were not selected and that some candidates failed to make use of the opportunity when the Commission invited applications for appointment to the post of Full-time Junior Professors and Part-Time Junior Professor. It was also pointed out to the Government that these posts have since been excluded from the Commission's purview. However in G.O. Ms. No. 1733, Education, dated 28th December 1990, the Government have issued orders regularising the services of 14 Junior Professors (redesignated as Lecturer (Senior Scale) with effect from 28th December 1990 (i.e., dated of G.O.) notwithstanding the views of the Commission in the matter.

**B. Non-Consultation with the Commission in certain cases.**

1. *G.O. Ms. No. 2167 Public Works Department, dated 29th December 1988.*

In G.O. Ms. No. 2167, Public Works (DI), dated 29th December 1988, amendment to Ad-hoc rules prescribing the qualification for the post of Testing Assistant in the Ground Water Branch of the Public Works Department in the Tamil Nadu Engineering Subordinate Services were issued. According to Article 320 (3) of the Constitution of India, the Commission should have been consulted before the issue of the amendment to Ad-hoc rules for the post which is within the Commission's purview. The Commission was not consulted in the matter. Hence, the Government were requested to state the circumstances under which the Commission was not consulted before the amendments to Ad-hoc rules were issued. The Government have stated that due to oversight the Commission was not consulted before the issue of amendment and added that this lapse will not recur.

2. *G.O. Ms. No. 192, Home Department, dated 25th January 1990.*

In G.O. Ms. No. 192, Home, dated 25th January 1990 orders were issued to the effect that five of the posts in category 2 of the Tamil Nadu Transport Service excluding 3 posts of Assistants Engineer (Motor Vehicles) be earmarked for appointment from among Personal Assistant. The Commission was not consulted before the orders were issued. According to the Instructions issued in U.O.

Note No. 4020/54-2, Public (Services), dated 11th September 1954 and letter No 63278/89 dated 25-9-89 of the Govt. in the Personal and Administrative Reforms (per m.) department the commission should be consulted before any decision affecting the method of recruitment or the principle followed in making appointments to posts within its purview is taken and not merely at the time of framing of rules or issuing the amendments thereon. The Government were therefore requested to state the circumstances under which the Commission was not consulted before the orders were issued. The Government have stated that the Tamil Nadu Transport Department Staff Association has represented that there are 38 posts of Regional Transport officers inclusive of Assistant Secretary, Secretary, State Transport Appellate Tribunal and Departmental Representative, in the Transport Department, that to fill up these posts, the ratio, of 1 : 4 from among Ministerial and Technical staff is now applied that when the staff from the Ministerial staff become Regional Transport Officer they are old to or and they retire very soon and that hence those vacancies are also occupied by the promotee from the Technical Staff. So, at a given time, the number of Ministerial Regional Transport Officers and Technical Regional Transport Officers are not in the ratio of 1 : 4, though the ratio is applied for promotion. To set right this imbalance the Association has requested the Government to consider promotion from among the Ministerial staff of the Transport Department and take necessary steps to maintain the ratio of 1:4 among the total number of posts available. The total number of posts in the posts of Personal Assistant is 36. The Government have stated that considering these figures the request of the Ministerial Staff Association that 1/5th of the pos. should be reserved for the category by compartmentalisation is quite justified and that the request has been examined in detail and orders issued in G.O. Ms. No. 192, Home, dated 24th January 1990 after obtaining order in circulation. The Government have also stated that by sheer inadvertence the Commission was not consulted, that the orders issued in the above G. O. is an important policy matter and that the views of the Commission will be obtained at the time of issue of amendments to special rules.

### 3. G. O. Ms. No. 2457, Revenue, dated 30th December 1988.

In G. O. Ms. No. 2457, Revenue, dated 30th December 1988 Executive orders were issued to the effect that the services rendered in all posts of Tahsildars are equivalent to service as Tahsildar in charge of a Taluk for purpose of considering one's name for inclusion in the panel of Deputy Collectors and that a minimum period of one year service as Tahsildar is necessary for appointment as Deputy Collectors. The Commission was not consulted before the issue of the executive orders. According to the instructions issued in U.O. Note. No. 4020/54-2, Public (Services), dated 11th September 1954, the Commission should be consulted before any decision affecting the method of recruitment or the principle followed in making appointment to the posts within its purview is taken and not merely at the time of framing of rules or issuing amendments thereon. The Government were requested to state the circumstances under which the Commission was not consulted before the executive orders were issued. The Government have stated that consultation with the Commission was inadvertently and regretably omitted.

### ACKNOWLEDGEMENT.

The Commission records its appreciation of the willing Co-operation extended by various trusts, Educational Institutions and their Officers in the matter of providing suitable accommodation for the various examinations held by the Commission.

The Commission is also grateful to the examiners and expert advisers in spite of their personal inconvenience readily accepted the Commission's invitations and assisted it in the conduct of different examinations and selections of Officers to various posts under the State Government.

Finally, the Commission places on record its appreciation of the loyal and efficient service rendered by its Staff throughout the year.
