The Commission are required to advice Government on all matters relating to framing of recruitment rules, principles to be followed in making appointments, promotions and transfer from one service to another service, in respect of disciplinary matters affecting Government Servants and to make direct recruitment to the State, Subordinate and Ministerial Services. The Commission conducts Departmental examinations for Government Servants and also conducts the examination on behalf of the Government of India, Ministry of Defence for admission to Rashtriya Indian Military College, Dehra Dun

IX. Notification.—The Commission advertised 20 notifications comprising 1155 vacancies in 27 posts under different services of the State.

X. Reforms and Rationalisation.—The Commission is continuously engaged in reviewing its selections process taking into consideration the latest developments in organisations similar to Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission engaged in recruitment work.

#### **SECTION-II**

DIRECT RECRUITMENT,—During the period the Commission conducted preliminary examination for 7 recruitments for 3154 vacancies. 4,91,458 candidates were admitted to the Preliminary examination. The Commission conducted main written examination for 24 recruitments consisting of 147 vacancies 6539 candidates were admitted to main written examination. The Commission conducted oral examination for 49 recruitments containing 451 vacancies 1131 candidates were admitted to oral examination. The Commission finally recommended 363 candidates for appointments through written-cum-oral tests. Thus 363 candidates were selected for appointment in recruitments. The details of 45 recruitments statistics are given in the Annexure-II

#### GROUP SERVICES

GROUP I SERVICES.--The Commission issued notification on 15th June 1992 for Group I Services examinations containing 30 vacancies. 32,879 applications were received. The preliminary examination was held on 3rd October 1992. On the basis of preliminary examinations. 300 candidates have been admitted to main written examination. The main written examination was conducted from 26th March 1993 to 31st March 1993.

GROUP II SERVICES.—The Commission issued notification on 6th April 1993 for Group II Services examination containing 396 vacancies 57,866 applications were received. The preliminary examination was held on 8th January 1994. On the basis of preliminary examination 3170 candidates have been admitted to main written examination. The main written examination proposed to be held in the month of July 1994.

GROUP III SERVICES.—The Commission issued notification on 6th April 1993 for Group III Services examination. 49,171 applications were received. The preliminary examination was held on 9th January 1994. On the basis of preliminary examination 380 candidates have been admitted to main written examination. The main written examination proposed to be held in the month of July 1994.

GROUP IV SERVICES.—The Commission issued notification on 6th February 1993 for Group IV services consisting 2,700 vacancies 3,63,382 applications were received from candidates. The preliminary examination was held on 18th July 1993. On the basis of preliminary examination 27,000

candidates have been admitted to main written examination. The main written examination was held on 23-4-94 in 38 centres.

The Commission issued notification on 15-7-93 for Group-IV Services Stono-typist/Personal Clerk, Consists of 453 vacancies 1933 candidates appeared for the main written examination held on 23-1-94.

GROUP V SERVICES.-- The Commission issued notification on 22nd February 1993 for Group V Services containing 11 vacancies 2400 applications were received. The preliminary examination was held on 3-10-93. On the basis of preliminary examination 118 candidates have been admitted to main written examination.

GROUP VII SERVICES.—The Commission issued notification on 27.12.92 for Group VII Services containing 6 vacancies. 6,293 applications were received. The preliminary examination was held on 4-4-93. The process of further work was stopped due to stay at High Court, Madras.

**GROUP VIII SERVICES** The Commission issued notification on 27-12-92 for Group VIII Services consisting 24 vacancies 11,916 application were received. The preliminary examination was held on 27-6-93. The process of further work was stopped due to stay at High Court, Madras.

PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION During the period under report the Commission conducted 7 preliminary examinations, consisting of 3,154 vacancies 4,91,458 candidates were admitted to preliminary examinations.

MAIN WRITTEN EXAMINATION During the period under report the Commission conducted 24 main written examination on to fill up 147 vacancies. 6,539 candidates were admitted to those main written examination.

ORAL EXAMINATION During the period under report the Commission conducted oral test for 49 recruitments to fill up 451 vacancies. The Commissions sat for interview on 58 days. The oral test were held in two sessions one in F.N. and the other in the A.N. Maximum of 3 Boards sat in both sessions on some days. 1131 candidates were admitted to oral test. 109 total sessions took place in the current year. #### SECTION III

PAUCITY OF QUALIFIED AND SUITABLE CANDIDATES FOR CERTAIN CATEGORIES OF POST There were Paucity of qualified suitable candidates for certain categories of posts like Statistical Assistant-3 Assistant Professor of Radiology Physics-1, Radio Supervisor-8, Thus 36 total vacancies could not be filled up during this year.

- 5 Concurrence under Rule 20 (a) (iii) of the Special Rules for the Tamil Nadu Ministerial Service. The Commission accorded its consent under the provision in Rule 20 (a) (iii) of the Special rules for Tamil Nadu Ministerial Service for the Permanent transfer of 293 personnel from one department unit to another departmental unit within the Tamil Nadu Ministerial Service and in 6 cases refused.
- 6. Promulgation and Amendments.— During the period under report, there were 201 cases of issue of statutory Rules or amendment to them by the Government of them, in respect of 178 cases, the Commission was consulted before the rules were issued and in 23 cases the Commission was not consulted. However, those cases relate either to posts excluded from the purview of the Commission or to matters in respect of which under Article 320 (3) of the Constitution of India Consultation with the commission was not necessary.
- 7. Relaxation.— During the period under report, there were 112 cases in which Statutory rules relating to age and educational qualifications as the case may be, were relaxed by the Government.

In one case, orders of relaxation were issued by the Government in respect of pension matters. In two cases, orders of relaxation were issued in respect of certain provisions of the Fundamental Rules. Tamil Nadu Special Pay and Allowances Rules and the Tamil Nadu Travelling Allowance Rules. In no case orders of relaxation was issued by the Government in respect of certain provision of the General Provident Fund (Madras) Rules.

#### SECTION V

Other than Recruitment Examinations.

(I) DEPARTMENTAL EXAMINATION The departmental tests were conducted in May and November 1993. The total number of tests conducted were 299 and the number of candidates applied to the tests were 83,021. The details are given below.

- II. HALF YEARLY EXAMINATION 63 and 112 candidates respectively appeared in the September 1993 and March 1994 Half Yearly Examination including first class language test in Tanul conducted for Assistant Collectors, Police Officer and Forest Officers.
- III. PROFICIENCY TEST IN TAMIL. The Commission issued notification in September 1993 inviting applications for proficiency test in Tamil for all Indian Officers whose Mother Tongue is not Tamil None applied to this examination.
- IV. RASHTRIYA INDIAN MILITARY COLLEGE SCHOOL, DEHRA DUN EXAMINATION. The Commission conducted an examination on behalf of the Government of India, Ministery of Defence in August 1993 and in February 1994 for selection of candidates for admission to Rashtriya Indian Military College School in Dehra Dun 96 and 152 candidates appeared for the examination 2 candidates were selected in August 1993 examination and results are awaited for the examination held in February 1994.

#### SECTION VI

#### Reforms and Rationalisation

(1) Member J. Ramalingam Sub-Committee Report. The direct recruitment was done by Commission, each recruitment is handled by a separate section. The recruitment section was done by all works and also specialised in all matters. For the reasons the recruitment was delayed and it takes more time. To avoid all the delays a committee under the Chairmanship of Member J. Ramalingam and member Thiru. G. Selvaganapathy, Thirumathy K. Nayakam, Dr. M.S. Ramachandran and Thiru. C. Chellappan was constituted. The Sub-committee discussed the matter relating to recruitment in detail, in all aspects with Commission Officers and staff members on the pros and Cons of the new system on functional basis.

The following are the sailent features of the new systems.

- (1) The activities in the recruitment process are divided into different jobs of functional basis.
- (2) Each recruitment work has to be handled by a seperate department.
- (3) The department concerned has to be specialised in each and every aspect of work.
- (4) The particular work has to be completed within the prescribed time.
- (5) Seperate Legal cell has to be established to deal with all legal cases relating to the Commissions.
  - (6) A well developed computer section has to be set up.
- (7) Monitor section, has to be established to check the activities of all work done by the different departments. The Sub Committee recommendations are to be implemented from the month of June 1994 onwards.

(2) ADDITION AND DELETION OF OPTIONAL SUBJECTS IN GROUP II AND GROUP III SERVICES. Group II Services in the scheme of main written examination, the list of optional subjects in Part I relating to language and Literature are 32 in Part II, there are 36 optionals consisting many subjects in the same discipline. The Commission analysed the matter in depth and also considering the Group I Service Pattern of optional subjects, some subjects were added and some subjects were deleted.

Group III Services, in the scheme of main written examination only a few candidates choose some of the optional subjects and some subjects are taught only in few schools. The Commission analysed the matter and deleted some subjects.

By the deletion of some optional subjects, the work on question paper setting and related expenditure are reduced.

- (3) COMPULSORY LANGUAGE PAPER. In all group Services examinations, English paper was a compulsory subject. Tamil Language as not given due importance in the examination. Hence the Commission decided to introduce the compulsory Language paper, General Tamil/General English in the S.S.L.C. standard in all recruitment examination,
- 4. District Revenue Officer and Chief Educational Officer as a Co-ordinating officers for commission Examination-The Commission conduct the preliminary and main written examination for direct recruitment. The Commission suggested the Government that for all preliminary and main written examination in the district level, district Revenue Officer may be appointed as Co-ordinating Officer and for Madras City, Chief Educational Officer may be appointed as Co-ordinating Officer. The Government Accepted this and issued orders in G O.Rt.No.3725, Public (Special) department dated, 5-11-1993 and G.O.Rt.No.1029, Education (A2) Department dated 9-11-1993.
- 5. Double Valuation of answer books in the main written examination The Commission have decided to introduce the double valuation system in all recruitment examinations. In the initial stage this will be implemented in all main written examination except for Group IV services examination. In Group IV Services written examination, single valuation will be done, with the Chief Examiner doing valuation in 10% of the scripts, evaluated by the initial examiner. It has also been accepted in principle to introduce the statistical moderation technique at the appropriate time in due course.
- 6. DEPARTMENT PROMOTION COMMITTEE -"The Commission recommended that 'Departmental Promotion Committees' might be set up with a view to ensuing objectivity in the appraisal of merit and ability of Government employees for selection to various posts by recruitment by transfer from a subordinate service, or by promotion from one category to another category or from one class the another class in a State Service for which the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission is required to be consulted. This was recommended also with a view to avoiding delay in selection of candidates to higher posts. The Government after careful consideration of the porposal sent by the Commission have issued orders to set up Departmental Promotion committees in G.O. Ms.No 15, P & A.R. (Personnel-S) dated 12-1-1994"

#### SECTION VII

## NON - ACCEPTANCE OF COMMISSION'S ADVICE

During the year under report the Government have deviated in seven cases from the Commission's advice.

Thus the Government have violated their own instructions and the Commission trust that this will not recur in future.

The details of the number of cases in which the Government have not accepted the Commission's advice, the Government have not consulted the commission are given for the latest five years in Annexure-XI.

## INSTANCES OF DEVIATION BY THE GOVERNMENT FROM THE COMMISSION'S ADVICE.

- 1. G.O. Ms.No. 433, Agriculture, dated 27-3-1987.—In July 1986, the Government sought the Commission's views on the disciplinary action taken under rule 17(b) of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Classification, Control and Appeal) Rules against formerly Assistant Director of Animal Husbandry and Superintendent Livestock Farm Hosur. The Commission held the charges framed against him as proved and advised to impose the penalty of stoppage of increment for one year without cumulative effect. But the Government in deviation of the Commission's advice, issued orders removing him from service. Since a copy of the commission's views was not communicated to the delinquent officer, the Government were requested to state whether the Chief Minister's consent was obtained before withholding the communication of the Commission's views to the delinquent officer. The Government have stated that the prescribed procedure has been followed. But on the legal remedy sought for by the delinquent officer, the Tamil Nadu Administrative Tribunal has quashed the Government Order imposing the penalty of removal from service on the main ground that the Chief Minister's special permission was not obtained for not communicating the Commission's views to the delinquent officer.
- 2. G.O.No. (D) 452, Health and Family welfare, dated 11-8-1993.—During February 1992, the Government have sought the views of the Commission on the appeal of formerly District Health Officer, Vellore (and now Deputy Director of Health Services, Ramanathapuram) preferred against the punishment of stoppage of increment for one year without cumulative effect imposed on him, as to the orders to be passed on the appeal. It was reported that the P.A. (Accounts) to Collector, North Arcot District reported to the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine, Madras that the appellant was granted a sum of Rs.1,18,000/- to purchase a ready built house, but he failed to submit the mortgage bond in form 4 in duplicate with in three months from the date of receipt of the advance and that despite the issue of repeated reminders, he had not submitted the mortgage bond in Form-4, in violation of the House Building Advance Rules. Hence the Director of public Health and Preventive Medicine, Madras called for the explanation of the appellant as to why disciplinary action should not be taken against him as per rule 17(a) of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Classification, control and Appeal) Rules. The appellant submitted his explanation. Not convinced with the explanation submitted by the appellant, the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine, Madras Passed orders stopping his increment for one year without cumulative effect. Against that order, the appellant has preferred an appeal to the Government. The commission which was consulted by the Government opined that the appeal of the appellant might be rejected as devoid of merits. But the Government deviation of the Commission's advice modified the punishment of stoppage of increment for one year without cumulative effect into one of 'Censure' and issued orders in G.O. (D) No 452, Health and Family Welfare, dated 11-8-1993. The Government have stated the following as reasons for the issue of such orders:

The Government have stated that there is no malafice intention on the part of the appellant in submitting the deed belatedly and in view of this, the appellant deserved to be shown leniency. They have further stated that the lapse committed by him does not lead to any irregularity or malpractice or corruption. They have therefore decided to modify the punishment of stoppage of increment for one year without cumulative effect into one of 'Censure' accordingly they have issued orders in G.O.(D) No.452, Health and Family Welfare, dated 11-8-1993 in deviation of the commission's views

3. G.O.(D) No.64, Social Welfare and Nutritious Meal Programme, dated 2-8-1993.—During November 1990, the Government in the Social Welfare and Nutritious Meal Programme Department had sought the views of the Commission on the appeal of formerly Supervisor, for centre Numbers 474 and 475 of Project - V ICDS-II, Madras, preferred against the punishment of stoppage of increment for three months without cumulative effect imposed on her, as to the orders to be passed on the appeal. It was reported that during a surprise inspection of the above centres by the Director of Social Welfare, certain irregularities were noticed against the appellant. Hence the Director of social Welfare totally framed 10 charges against the appellant under rule 17(b) of the Tamil Nadu civil Services (Classification, Control and Appeal) Rules. The appellant submitted his explanation and requested to drop the charges. The appellant opted for an oral enquiry and personal hearing, the Enquiry Officer who conducted an oral enquiry drew up an enquiry report and held the charges 1,2,9 and 10 as proved. The Director of Social Welfare who conducted a personal hearing after examining the case held that the appellant was not directly responsible for the charges 6, 7 and 8 and dropped the charges 4 and 5 on the views

of the Enquiry Officer and also dropped the charges 9 and 10 since the action of the appellant in having left the headquarters during suspension was condoned and ratified and held the remaining three charges 1,2 and 3 as proved and for the proven charges imposed the punishment of stoppage of increment for three months without cumulative effect on the appellant. Against that order, the appellant has perferred an appeal to the Government. The Commission which was consulted by the Government opined that the appeal neds no reconsideration and it may be rejected. But the Government in deviation of the Commission's advice set aside the punishment order allowed the appeal and issued orders in G.O.(D) No.64, Social Welfare and Nutritious Meal Programme Department, dated 2-8-1993.

### The Government have stated the following as reasons for the issue of such orders

The report of the enquiry officer on the charges 1 and 2 reveals that the appellant was discharging her duties properly duly giving instructions to the Child Welfare Organisers. But she has been charge sheeted for not taking immediate action against the erring staff. The charges 1, 2 and 3 are not acceptable, the Government have therefore, decided to set aside the punishment order and to allow the appeal in deviation of the commission's advice. Accordingly they have issued orders in G.O.(D) No.64, Social Welfare and Nutritious Meal Programme Department dated 2-8-1993 in deviation of the Commission's advice.

- 4. G.O.Ms.No.665, Finance (Treasuries and Accounts), dated 17-9-1993.-During November '91 the Government have sought for the Commission's views as to the orders to be passed on the appeal preferred by Accountant. Office of the Accounts Officer (Funds) against the punishment of stoppage of increment for six months without cumulative effect imposed on him by the Director of Treasuries and Accounts. It was reported that during his surprise inspection of the Office of the Accounts Officer (Funds) the Joint Director, Treasuries and Accounts has found that the appellant went to the RBI, for encashing the cheques without making any entries in the movement register. The Accounts Officer (Funds) framed three charges against the appellant under rule 17(a) of the Tamil Nadu Civil Service (Classification, Control and Appeal) Rules as advised by the Joint Director. The Accounts Officer (Funds) has dropped the charges after obtaining explanation from the appellant and severly warned the appellant. the Director Treasuries and Accounts who reviewed the case under Rule 36 of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Classification, Control and Appeal) Rules issued a show cause notice to the appellant and obtained his representations on the show cause notice and imposed the punishment of stoppage of increment for six months without cumulative effect. Against that order, the appellant has preferred his present appeal to the Government. The Commission which was consulted by the Government opined that the appeal of the appellant might be rejected as devoid of merits. But the Government in deviation of the Commission's advice modified the punishment of stoppage of increment for six months without cumulative effect with one of censure and issued orders in GO.Ms.No.665, Finance (Treasuries and Accounts) on 17-9-1993. In the G.O. the Government have stated that the punishment imposed is very severe for the above said lapses and that therefore they have decided to modify the punishment into 'Censure'.
- 5. G.O.Ms.No.664, Finance (Treasuries and Accounts), dated 17-9-1993.-During November '91, the Government have sought for the Commission's views as to the orders to be passed on the appeal, preferred by Accountant, Office of the Accounts Officer (Funds) against the punishment of stoppage of increment for one year without cumulative effect imposed on him by the Director of Treasuries and Accounts. It was reported that during the surprise inspection of the Office of the Accounts officer by the Joint Director, Treasuries and Accounts he has found that the appellant without making any entries in the Movement Register, went to the other section, sat on the table and disturbing others not to do their office work properly. Hence the Accounts Officer framed three charges against the appellant under Rule 17(a) of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Classification, Control and Appeal) Rules as instructed by the Joint Director. The appellant admitted the charges and pleaded for excuse him this time The Accounts Officer has dropped the charges and severely warned the appellant The Director of Treasuries and Accounts, who reviewed the case under Rule 36 of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Classification, Control and Appeal ) Rules issued a show cause notice to the appellant and obtained his representations on the show cause notice and imposed the punishment of stoppage of increment for one year without cumulative effect. Against that order, the appellant has preferred his present appeal to the Government, opined that the appeal of the appellant be rejected as devoid of merits. But the Government in deviation of the Commission's advice modified the punishment for one year without

cumulative effect with one of 'Censure' and issued orders in G O Ms No 664, Finance (Treasuries and Accounts) on 17 9 93. In the G O the Government have stated that the punishment imposed is very severe for the above said lapses and that therefore they have decided to modify the punishment into 'Censure'

6. G.O. (D). NO. 87, Agriculture dated 14th July 1993:- During July '90 the Government sought the views of the Commission on the Review petition preferred by Assistant Director of Agriculture (T & V) Mayiladuthurai, to the Government against the punishment to stoppage of increment for two years without cumulative effect

The Review petitioner was working as Deputy Agricultural Officer in Thiruppuvanam Panchayat Union During December '80 and January '81, spraying of pesticide in four villages of the former Ramanathapuram District was carried out by the Agriculture Department. The Review Petitioner was requested to obtain tenders from Three persons and send them to the Assistant Director of Agriculture, Sivaganga. the tenders relating to Konthaga village was forwarded to the Assistant Director of Agriculture, Sivaganga duly counter-signed by the Deputy Agricultural Officer incharge of the office of the Thiruppuvanam the tender was given to one Thiru Beer Mohamed as he quoted to lowest The review Petitioner has obtained the Agreement on 23 12 80 from the contractor Also on 24 12 80 the Review petitioner has given a certificate that the contractor had completed the work Subsequently payments were made. It was found out that of the above three tenders, the tender relating to Beer Mohamed alone was genuine and the two other tenders were under ficticious names Them the tenders relating to the Kezapuvandhi, Melapuvandhi and Bottom Village obtained from three persons and submitted the Assistant Director of Agriculture, Sivaganga by the Review Petitioner for approval were subsequently found to be false by the Vigilance Department Thereafter finally a charged framed against the Review Petitioner under Rule 17(b) of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Classification control appeal) rules was held proved and Govt, passed final orders awarding stoppage of increment for two years without cumulative effect. Against these orders, the review petition preferred to the Government was forwarded to the commussion for its views The Commission advised the Government to modify the punishment of stoppage of increment for two years without cumulative effect already awarded, into that of stoppage of increment for six months without cumulative effect as the punishment already awarded was excessive But the Government in deviation of the Commission's advice rejected the Review petition and confirmed the punishment already awarded by them Government have not even made an indication to have consulted the Commission and have also not communicated a copy of the Commission's opinion to the Review Petitioner

7. G.O. Ms.No.1001, Transport, dated 23.9.93:- During July 1991, the Government sought the views of the Commission on the appeal preferred by formerly Time Keeper (Motor Vehicles Maintenance Department) against the orders of the Director of Motor Vehicles Maintenance Department, Madras dismissing him from the service for the proven charges framed against him that he had made an attempt to steal the Government property and misbehaved during the office time. The Commission examined the case and advised, that the orders issued by the Director of Motor Vehicles Maintenance Department is too harsh and that for the proven charges, the stoppage of increment for three years without cumulative effect might be imposed on the appellant. But the Government have stated that considering the gravity of the charges held proved and in the interest of efficient administration among technical workers in the various automobile unit in the State, they have rejected the appeal, in deviation of the Commission's advice (G O Ms.No 1001, Transport dated 23 9 93). But they have not even made an indication in the G O that they have consulted the Commission before orders were issued
