SECTION-I

FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES

Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission have to discharge the duties and functions specified in the Article, 320 of the Constitution. The Commission are required to advise Government on all matters relating to framing of recruitment rules, principles to be followed in making appointments, promotions and transfer from one service to another service, in respect of disciplinary maters affecting Government Servants and to make direct recruitment to the State, Subordinate and Ministerial Services. The Commission Conducts Departmental examinations for Government Servants and also conducts the examination on behalf of the Government of India, Ministry of Defence for admission to Rashtriya Indian Military College, Dehra Dun.

- IX. Notification-The Commission advertised 26 notifications comprising 712 vacancies in 71 posts under different Services of the State. (for details Sec. Annexure-IV)
- X. Reforms and Rationalisation-The Commission is continuously engaged in reviewing its selection process taking into consideration the latest developments in organisations similar to Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission engaged in recruitment work.

SECTION-II

Direct Recruitment: During the period, the Commission conducted preliminary examination in 4 recruitments for 145 vacancies. 9,958 candidates were admitted to the preliminary examination. The Commission conducted main written examination for 51 recruitments consisting of 3,274 vacancies 36,745 candidates were admitted to main written examination. The Commission conducted Oral examination for 30 recruitments containing 289 vacancies. 1,309 candidates were admitted to oral examination. The Commission recommended 400 candidates for appointments through written-cum-oral-tests. Thus 3,435 candidates were selected for appointment in recruitments. The recruitment statistics in respect of 27 recruitments are given in the Annexure-II.

GROUP SERVICES

GROUP I SERVICES: The Commission issued notification on 15th June 1992 for group I Services examination containing 30 vacancies. 32,879 applications were received. The preliminary examination was held on 3rd October 1992. On the basis of preliminary examinations. 300 candidates were admitted to main written examination. The main written examination was conducted from 26th March 1993 to 31st March 1993. The oral test was held from 5th April 1994 to 8th April 1994. Finally 29 candidates were selected.

GROUP II SERVICES: The Commission issued notification on 6th April 1993 for group II Services Examination consisting 396 vacancies 57,866 applications were received. The preliminary examination was held on 8th January 1994. On the basis of preliminary examination 3170 candidates were admitted to main written examination. The main written examination was held from 29th August 1994 to 31st August 1994. The main written examination results were published in May 1995.

GROUP III SERVICES: The Commission issued notification on 6th April 1993 for Group III Services examination. 49,171 applications were received. The preliminary examination was held on 9th January 1994. On the basis of preliminary examination 380 candidates were admitted to main written examination. The main written examination was held from 26th August 1994 to 28th August 1994. On the basis of main written examination 124 candidates were admitted to oral test. The oral test was held in the month of April 1995.

GROUP IV SERVICES: The Commission issued notification on 6th February 1993 for Group IV Services consiting 2,700 vacancies 3,63,382 applications were received from candidates. The preliminary examination was held on 18th July 1993. On the basis of preliminary examination 27,000 candidates were admitted to main written examination. The main written examination was held on 23rd April 1994 in 38 centres. Based on the performance of the candidates in the written examination 2715 candidates have been selected and recommended for appointment. The selection results were published on 17th September 1994.

The Commission issued notificfation on 15th July 1993 for Group IV Services (Stenotypist/Personal Clerk) consisting of 453 vacancies 1933 candidates appeared in the main written examination held on 23 January 1994. On the basis of main written examination 351 candidates were selected.

GROUP V SERVICES: The Commission issued Notification on 22nd February 1993 for Group V Services consisting eleven vacancies. 2400 applications were received. The preliminary

examination was held on 3rd October 1993. On the basis of preliminary examination 118 candidates have been admitted to main written examination. The main written examination was held from 30th April 1994 to 2nd May 1994. On the basis of Main written examination 11 candidates were selected.

GROUP VII SERVICES: The Commission issued notification on 27th December 1992 for Group VII Services consisting of 6 vacancies. 6,293 applications were received. The preliminary examination was held on 4th April 1993. The process of further work was held up due to stay by Madras High Court. Now the stay has been withdrawn and results of preliminary examination declared. The main written examination will be conducted shortly.

GROUP VIII SERVICES: The Commission issued notification on 27th December 1992 for group VIII Services consisting of 24 vacancies. 11,916 applications were received. The preliminary examination was held on 27th June 1993. The process of further work was held up due to stay by Madras High Court. The stay has been withdrawn and preliminary examination result was declared. The main written examination will be conducted shortly.

PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION: During the period under report—the Commission conducted 4 preliminary examinations, consisting of 145 vacancies. 9958 candidates were admitted to preliminary examinations.

MAIN WRITTEN EXAMINATION: During the period under report the Commission conducted 51 main written examinations to fill up 3274 vacancies. 36745 candidates were admitted to those main written examinations.

ORAL EXAMINATION: During the period under report the commission conducted oral test for 30 recruitments to fill up 289 vacancies. The Commission sat for interview on 58 days. The oral tests were held in two sessions, one in F.N. and the other in the A.N. Maximum of 2 Boards sat in both sessions on some days. 1309 candidates were admitted to oral test 107 total sessions took place in the current year. The details of preliminary, main written and oral examinations are given in Annexure-V.

SECTION-III

PAUCITY OF QUALIFIED AND SUITABLE CANDIDATES FOR CERTAIN CAT-EGORIES OF POST: There were paucity of qualified and suitable candidates for certain categories of posts like District Munsif-14 and Steno-typist-53. Thus 67 total vacancies could not be filled up during this year.

4. Temporary Appointments:-The Commission accorded its concurrence for the continuance of temporary appointments in different posts included in Tamil Nadu State/Subordinate/Ministerial Services within the periods of 24 months in 762 cases and refused 118 cases and for more than

24 months, in 353 cases the concurrence was accorded and in 56 cases the concurrence was refused.

- 5. Concurrence under Rule 20 (a) (iii) of the Special Rule for the Tamil Nadu Ministerial Service: The Commission accorded its consent under the provision in Rule 20 (a) (iii) of the Special rules for Tamil Nadu Ministerial Service for the permanent transfer of 149 personnel from one departmental unit to another departmental unit within the Tamil Nadu ministerial Service and in 16 cases consent was refused.
- 6. Promulgation and Amendments:- During the period under report there were 153 cases of issue of statutory Rules or amendment to them by the Government of them in respect of 126 cases, the Commission was consulted before the rules were issued and in 27 cases the Commission was not consulted. However, those cases relate either to posts excluded from the purview of the Commission or to matters in respect of which under Article 320 (3) of the Constitution of India consultation with the Commission is not necessary.
- 7. Relaxation:- During the period under report, there were 76 cases in which statutory rules relating to age and educational qualifications as the case may be were relaxed by the Government. In 6 cases orders of relaxation were issued by the Government in respect of pension matters. No orders of relaxation were issued in respect of certain provisions of the Fundamental Rules, Tamil Nadu Special Pay and Allowances Rules and the Tamil Nadu Travelling Allowance Rules. No orders of relaxation was issued by the Government in respect of certain provision of the General Provident Fund (Madras) Rules.





NOTIFICATIONS ISSUED IN THE LAST FIVE YEARS PERIOD




WRITTEN EXAMINATIONS CONDUCTED IN THE LAST FIVE YEARS PERIOD




DETAILS OF ORAL TEST HELD IN THE LAST THREE YEARS PERIOD




NUMBER OF CANDIDATES SELECTED AND RECOMMENDED FOR APPOINTMENT IN THE LAST FIVE YEARS

- II. HALF YEARLY EXAMINATION.— 44 and 41 candidates respectively appeared in the September 1994 and March 1995 half yearly examination including first class language test in Tamil conducted for Assistant Collectors, Police Officers and Forest Officers.
- III. PROFICENCY TEST IN TAMIL.— The Commission issued notification in September 1994 inviting applications for proficiency test in Tamil for all India Officers whose mother tongue is not Tamil; None applied to this examination.
- IV. RASHTRIYA INDIAN MILITARY COLLEGE SCHOOL, DEHRA DUN EXAMINATION.— The Commission conducted the examination on behalf of the Government of India, Ministry of Defence in August 1994 and in February 1995 for selection of candidates for admission to Rashtriya Indian Military College School in Dehra Dun 143 and 103 candidates appeared for the examination one candidate was selected in August 1994 examination and results are awaited for the examination held in February 1995.

SECTION VI

REFORMS RATIONALISATION AND NEW PROCEDURES ADOPTED.

1. Group I Services Examination on UPSC Model:

There is a general feeling that candidates hailing from Tamil Nadu are not fairing well in the UPSC Civil Services Examination. To improve their performance, the Commission thought that the Group I Services examination may be modified on the pattern of UPSC Civil Services examination in respect of scheme and syllabus and also in respect of required age and educational qualifications. A proposal in this regard was sent to the Government on 3-4-92 and the Government have issued necessary orders on 23-1-95 (G.O. Ms. No. 25, P&AR. dated 23-1-95). Hereafter, the preliminary and main examinations for Group I services will be of the same type that is followed by UPSC. This will facilitate candidates to appear both for TNPSC and UPSC examinations with single common preparation by choosing the same set of subjects.

2. Inclusion of Tamil Language as a compulsory subject:

The commission decided to include a compulsary subject paper on 'General Tamil or General English" of SSLC standard in all the recruitment examinations, as Tamil is used as official language at district level administration. A proposal was sent to the Government on 27-7-93 to issue necessary orders. Government orders are awaited in this regard (Government letter No.9630, P&AR dated 20-4-95).

3. Departmental Promotion Committee: The Government issued orders on G.O. Ms. No.15, P&AR dated 12-1-94 to set up Departmental Promotion Committee to ensure objectivity in appraisal of qualified employees for promotion to higher cadre posts and also to shorten the time element in such process. The Commission is happy to note that this system have worked well and more number of employees have been benefited by the Departmental Promotion Committee system (Details Annexure VII)

As per Article 320 (3) (b) of the Constitution of India it shall be the duty of the Commission to give their views on the principles to be followed in making appointments to Civil Services and posts and in making promotions and transfers from one service to another and on the suitability of candidates for such appointments by promotion or by transfer. There is to fixed programme for recruitment by transfer. But the process has quite often ran behind the schedule for valid and unavoidable reasons. The customary practice of getting the proposals from the Head of Departments and calling for the requisite details has resulted in delay in finalising the selections which eventually affected the career prospects of the Government servants.

The present Commission, in the interest of the administration of the State as a whole, felt that it is high time to keep pace with the surging scientific advancement and changing trends. With this end in view, the Commission modelled on the procedure followed in certain State Public Service Commission and the Union Public Service Commission has evolved a system of processing the selections in recruitment by transfer through D.P.C. and obtained the specific orders of the Government therefor. A fixed calender programme has also been evolved by the Government in consultation with the Commission to finalise the selections every year.

(Under the new system, proposals are sent to the Commission by the Administrative Department in the Secretariat. The discrepancies in the proposals are set right through informal discussions among concerned officers. Matters requiring approval at the higher level, are raised at the D.P.C. meeting and a decision is arrived at. The minutes of the meeting containing the list of candidates recommended for selection or otherwise are drawn up then and there and got approved by the D.P.C. The minutes are forwarded to the Government in a day or two. Orders of the Government approving the selection are also being issued at the earliest. Thus the new system has put an end to protracted correspondence among the Commission, Government and Head of the Department.)

The main objective of the new system is to eliminate delays. The fact that 2820 candidates have been selected by the D.P.C. within a span of 9 months is an eloquent testimony to this objective. During this period 46 meetings of the D.P.C. were held. The following sample data will reveal the volume of work turnover of the D.P.C. in the first 9 months period of its inception:

In the new system, a ban on drawal of temporary panels has been imposed. The departments were left with no alternative but to draw up regular panels after clearing the pending selections. The selections that were pending for more than a decade ie. D.O./P.A. (PD) to the Collector in the Tamil Nadu Panchayat Development Service from 80-81, Assistant Director of Handloom and Textiles in the Tamil Nadu Handloom and Textiles Service from 81-82. Assistant Director of Survey and Land Records in the Tamil Nadu Survey and Land Record Service from 85-86. Research Officer in the Evalution and Applied Research Department in the Tamil Nadu General Service from 84-85 and Municipal Commissioner Grade -III in the Tamil Nadu Municipal Commissioner Service from 83-84, have been cleared and now many departments fill up vacancies from the current panel itself.

The new system is a boon to the State Government Staff. Under the old system, temporary panels were drawn up based on the proposals sent to the Government by the Head of the Department. As the immediate personnel needs of the Departments were met, the drawal of regular panels through the Commission became a non-priority item of work. Consequently, there was uncertainty in the minds of the staff as to whether their names will be included in the regular panel. Under the new system, as regular panels are drawn straight away this uncertainty has been removed

4. Improved Facilities Provided:

- 1. Considering the constitutional status accorded to the Member of the Commission the Government were requested to approve the proposal for air-conditioning the chambers of Members of the Commission. The Government have cleared the proposal under Part-II scheme in the financial year, 1995-96.
- 2. The computer system now in use in the Commission Office was installed in the year 1988 by the Computer Maintenance Corporation. This system has now become outmoded and it had also lost its life span. From the software aspect also, its utility are very much limited. It is being utilized only for pre-examination work. To expand the computerisation to post examination works, Scanner Evaluation, Optical Machine Reader application forms, the commission sent a proposal for installation of a latest on line computer system, and the Government have cleared the proposal costing about Rs.45,00,000/-
- 3. The Commission represented to the Government to revise the scales of pay of its staff members on par with Union Public Service Commission and Tamil Nadu Secretariat Service Staff Members. The Government have accepted the proposal in principle and have requested the Commission to formulate service rules accordingly constituting the service in the Commission as separate entity. The commission is taking up expenditious action in this line.
- 4. To cope with the expanding workload and to facilitate installation of modern gadgets of administration and also to avoid occupation of private rental buildings at times of mass recruitments like group IV, the Commission proposed construction of an additional five storied building. The Government have agreed to the proposal and have sanctioned Rs 109.90 lakhs for initial foundation laying work.
- 5. To improve the facilities provided in the Office premises, the existing PBX telephone system has been replaced by a modern EPABX system. This will provide move intercommunication facilities, besides providing independent outer call facilities. The Government have sanctioned Rs. 2.72 lakhs for this work.
- 6. Intermittent power failure disturbed the continuity of work, in the Data Processing Department, and at times, all the data kept in the memory were erased by long cessation of power supply. To avoid such contingencies, the commission proposed to provide to the computer wing an uninterrupted power supply system along wth a generator motor. The Government have sanctioned Rs.2.75 lakhs for this purpose. This has facilitated continuous and smooth running of the installed computer system. This will also provide additional safety to the proposed installation of latest on line computer system.

5. Reorganisation of Office work on functional basis.

A committee under the Chairmanship of Member Thiru J. Ramalingam recommended certain measures to improve the work turnover in the direct recruitment wing. These included reorganisation of Office work on the concept of division of labour, introduction of modern computer system, implementation of new procedural methods in examination wing so that time delay in completion or any recruitment may be reduced to an optimum level. The Commission has put into practice those recommendations from 1-1-95 by reorganising the whole office structure.

6. Reservation Policy - Communal Rotation - Roster.

The commission after careful examination have designed a new 100 point roster reflecting the real spirit enunciated in different Government orders on the Communal reservation Policy. This has been sent to Government on 20-12-94 for its consideration and to effect necessary changes in the existing roster. Government Orders in this regard are awaited (Government letter No.97820/R/94-3, P&AR, Dated 17-2-95).

7. Examination Reforms:

- (a) Question Bank: The Commission have developed for the first time a question bank for objective Type Questions in respect of 25 subjects in Bachelor's degree standard by collecting objective type items from various examiners. This question bank will be utilised for setting up of question papers in the future. The Commission have also proposed to evolve a system in which the question Bank will become a permanent feature.
- **(b) OMR, Application Forms:** The Commission have decided to introduce the OMR application forms in their next group I Services Preliminary Examination. The candidates will be asked to provide information in the coded form along with the usual detailed information. This coded data will be read by the Optical Machine Reader. The Commission hopes that this will save time in the scrutiny process of application forms.
- **(c) Date of written Examination:** The Commission now specify in their notification itself the month in which the written examination for the recruitment will be conducted. This gives an opportunity to the applicants to prepare for the examinations well in advance.
- **(d) Acknowledgement :** The Commission have ordered that the applications received by the Office across the Office counter should be acknowledged instantaneously. This order had already been put into practice.
- **(e) Inspection:** Based on the orders of the Commission the officers of the Commission are being deputed for inspection of all examination centres to have more effective control in the conduct of the written examinations.

SECTION VII

NON-ACCEPTANCE OF COMMISSION ADVICE

During the year under report the Government have deviated in 3 cases from the commission's advice.

Thus the Government have violated their own instructions and the Commissions trust that this will not recur in future.

The details of the number of cases in which the Government have not accepted the Commission's advice and the Government have not consulted the commission are given for the latest five years in Annexure-XI.

1. Copy of Government Letter No.32648/U/94-2, P&AR, dated 21-3-95.—An individual had applied and was selected as Assistant through the Special Qualifying Examination conducted by the Commission in 1977. As he had applied for classification under schedule Tribe- Konda Reddi and produces a community certificate to that effect obtained from the Tahsildar, Thuraiyur, Trichy, he was given allotment against Schedule Tribes vacancy and allotted as Assistant in Secretariat. The Collector of Trichy was addressed to enquire and report regarding his community. The Collector of Trichy reported that the candidate did not belong to 'Konda Reddy" community but actually belonged to "Reddy" community which is a Forward Community and the community certificate issued by the Tahsildar, Thuraiyur on 27-9-77 as "Konds Reddy" was a flase one.

Ine person Iniru Rajendran (now working as Assistant Section Officer in the Public (L & O Department) was found guilty of having produced a false community certificate as Schedule Tribes (Konda Reddy) for admission to the Special qualifying examination of the Degree Standard conducted by the Commission in 1977. The Commission had cancelled the selection of the candidate and informed the Government to terminate his services and suggested to take disciplinary action including criminal action against him. The Government had not initiated Criminal action against him as suggested by the Commission and initiated only disciplinary action and awarded him a punishment of stoppage of increment for three years with cumulative effect. But the Commission did not accept this and reiterated its earlier stand and recommended that the Government might revise the orders already issued. In reply, the Government stated that the stoppage of increment for 3 years with cumulative effect was awarded after observing the procedural requirements for imposing the major penalty and in view of the factors, further course of action does not seem necessary at this distance of time. Thus, the Government disagreed with the views of the Commission.

2. G.O. No. (3D) No. 109, Public Works Department, dated 30-6-94.—During November 1993, the Government sought the views of the Commission on the disciplinary action initiated against an Assistant Executive Engineer, Public Works Department as to the orders to be passed on the case. It was reported that during the course of an enquiry into certain allegations of corruption and malpractices against the delinquent by the Chief Engineer (General) it was noticed that certain serious irregularities by way of discrepancies in the dates of check measurements and thandu removal certificates. Based on the direction by the Chief Engineer, the Superintending Engineer, Public Works Department, Chengalpattu Circle at Kancheepuram, framed five charges against the deliquent under rule 17(b) of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Discipline and Appeal) rules. The delinquent submitted his explanation and requested to drop the charges. The delinquent opted for an Oral enquiry and Personal hearing in the questionaire form. The Enquiry Officer who was nominated for the purpose, after observing the usual formalities, drew up an enquiry report wherein he held the charges 1, 2 and 5 as proved.

The Chief Engineer (General) remitted the case to the Government along with his remarks. The Government held all the five charges as proved and by enclosing a copy of the enquiry report directed the delinquent to submit his representation on the findings of the Enquiry Officer and also on the Conclusion of the Government. The delinquent submitted his representation. Commission which was consulted by the Government in its letter dated 18-7-94 opined that the punishment of stoppage of increment for three years without cumulative effect might be imposed on the delinquent for the charges held proved against him. It has also pointed out to the Government that since the delinquent has to retire from service on 30-06-94 on superannuation, it has advised that the monotary recovery equivalent to the said punishment may be imposed on the delinquent. But the Government, in deviation of the Commission's views, issued orders dropping the charges as not pressed in G.O. 3D. No.109, Public Works Department, dated 30-06-94 (on the date of superannuation of the delinquent). In the Government Order the Government have stated that all the five proven charges relate to the discrepancies in the dated of check measurements and thandu removal certificates and that there is no financial loss to the Government. They have therefore taken a liberal view and decided not to press the charges and issued orders dropping the charges.

3. G.O. Ms. No. 169/RD & LA Department, dated 13-04-94 and G.O.Ms.No. 170/RD & LA department, dated 13-04-94.— During January 1991, the Government sought the views of the Commission on the disciplinary action taken against formerly Block Development Officers.

The delinquent officers were working as Block Development Officers, Madurai West Panchayat Union, from 1-3-80 to 2-5-83 and 17-06-81 to 02-5-83 respectively. During the period, the competent authority conducted enquiry regarding certain complaints received against them and submitted report substantiating the allegations that the Delinquent Officers had made excess payments of Rs. 18,186.85 and Rs. 2002.20 each in the purchase of 125w. mercury vapour lamp Street Light fittings for various Panchayat Unions. They had also jointly paid excess amount of Rs. 3337 in another case in the purchase of 125 watt Sodium Vapour Lamps, in violation of the orders issued G.O. Ms. No. 2072, Rural Development Department, dated 27-12-1977. It was

ordered to take departmental action to recover the loss caused to the Government. Therefore, the Collector had framed charges against them under Rule 17(b) of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Classification, Control and Appeal) Rules. After following the prescribed procedure it was held that they had made loss to the Government to the tune of Rs. 19,855.35 and Rs. 3670.70 respectively and, therefore, the charges were held proved. The case was remitted to Government for passing final orders. The Government had sought the views of the Commission which relates to seeking advice of the Commission in so far as recovering the loss caused to the Government from Delinquent Officers. The Commission after examination of the case had advised the Government to recover Rs. 19855.35 and Rs. 3670.70 from Delinquent Officer I and Delinquent Officer II respectively.

Accepting the views of the Commission the Government had issued orders in G.O. Ms. No. 169 RD&LA, dated 13-04-94 and G.O.Ms. No. 170 RD & LA, dated 13-04-94 respectively for the recovery of the said loss. In addition to the Commission's advice, the Government had also inflicted a minor penalty of stoppage of increment for two years without cumulative effect on the delinquent Officers for which the Commission was not consulted. The fact remains that the Commission has advised the Government to impose the penalty of recovery towards the loss caused to the Government after taking into account of the entire amount of the charges.

Having consulted the Commission and obtained its views once, it is not appropriate for the Government to take decision suo moto for imposing a minor penalty in addition to the one recommended by the Commission.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

The Commission records its appreciation of the willing Co-operation extended by various Trusts, Educational Institutions and their Officers in the matter of providing suitable accommodation for the various examinations held by the Commission.

The Commission is also grateful to the Examiners and Expert Advisers who inspite of their personal inconvenience readily accepted the Commission's invitations and assisted it in the conduct of different examination and selections of officers to various posts under the State Government.

The Commision wishes to thank all the Secretaries to Government and Heads of Departments for their kind co-operation in finalising the selections of candidates for appointment by recruitment by transfer/promotion through the Departmental Promotion Committees.

Finally the Commission places on record its appreciation of the loyal efficient service rendered by its staff throughout the year.
