SECTION-I

FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES

The Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission has to discharge the duties and functions specified in article 320 of the constitution. The Commission is required to advice Government on all matters relating to framing of recruitment rules, principles to be followed in making appointments and promotions and transfers from one service to another service, in respect of disciplinary matters affecting Government Servants and to make direct recruitment to the State Subordinate and Ministerial Services. The Commission conducts Departmental Examinations for Government Servants and also conducts the examination on behalf of the Government of India, Ministry of Defence for admission to Rashtriya Indian Military College, Dehra Dun.

^{9.} Notification:—The Commission advertised 37 Notifications comprising of 1,128 vacancies in respect of 37 posts under different services of the State (for details see Annexure-IV).

^{10.} Reforms and Rationalisation:—The Commission is continuously engaged in reviewing its selection process taking into consideration, the latest developments in organisations similar to Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission engaged in recruitment work.

SECTION-II

DIRECT RECRUITMENT:

During the period the Commission conducted preliminary examination in respect of 5 recruitments for 922 vacancies, 1,43,510 candidates were admitted to the Preliminary Examination. The Commission conducted Main Written Examination for 24 recruitments consisting of 1568 vacancies 26,686 candidates were admitted to Main Written Examination. The Commission conducted oral examination for 28 Recruitments containing 1,343 vacancies; 3,330 candidates were admitted to oral examination. The Commission finalised 30 Recruitments containing 2,019 vacancies and recommended 1,762 candidates for appointments, the recruitment statistics in respect of 30 recruitments are given in the Annexure-II.

GROUP - I SERVICES:

GROUP -I SERVICES

- (a) The Commission issued notification on 30-4-1996 for Group I Services Examination containing 30 vacancies, 26,269 applications were received. The Preliminary Examination was held on 27-10-1996 on the basis of Preliminary Examination. 301 candidates were admitted to Main Written Examination. The Main Written was held from 14-6-97 to 27-6-97. The oral Tests was held on 17-12-97 and 18-12-97 Finally 30 candidates were selected.
- (b) The Commission issued notification on 7-7-97 for Group-I Services Examination containing 42 vacancies, 46,193 applications were received. The Preliminary Examination was held on 14-9-97. The Main Written Examination will be held on 19-5-98 to 12-6-98.
- (c) The Commission issued notification on 7-1-98 for Group I Services Examination containing 84 vacancies, 67,000 application were received. The Preliminary Examination will be held in the month of June 1998.

COMBINED SUBORDINATE SERVICE EXAMINATION-I:

- (a) The Commission issued notification on 21-8-1995 for Combined Subordinate Service Examination-I consisting of 305 vacancies. 34,665 applications were received. The Preliminary Examination was held on 4th February 1996. On the basis of Preliminary Examination. 2,700 candidates were admitted to Main Written Examination. The Main Written Examination was held from 16-8-1996 to 18-8-1996. Finally 285 candidates were selected.
- (b) The Commission issued notification on 29-3-1997 for Combined Subordinate Service Examination-I consisting of 626 vacancies. 55,524 applications were received. The Preliminary Examination was held on 22-6-97.

GROUP IV SERVICES:

- (a) The Commission issued notification on 30-8-1996 for Group IV Services Steno-Typist Grade-III Examination containing 362 vacancies. 1,402 applications were received. The Main Written Examination was held on 23-2-1997. On the basis of Main Written 167 candidates were selected.
- (b) The Commission issued notification on 28-10-1996 for Group IV Services Junior Assistant cum Typist post consisting of 500 vacancies, 4,03,000 applications were received. The Preliminary Examination was held on 2-3-1997. The Main Written Examination was held on 21-12-97.

PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION:

During the period under report the Commission conducted 5 Preliminary Examinations, consisting of 922 vacancies; 1,43,510 candidates were admitted to Preliminary Examinations:

MAIN WRITTEN EXAMINATION:

During the period under report the Commission conducted 24 Main Written Examination to fill up 1568 vacancies; 26,686 candidates were admitted to these Main Written Examinations.

ORAL EXAMINATION:

During the period under report the Commission conducted Oral Test for 28 Recruitments to fill up 1343 vacancies. The Commission conducted interviews on 48 days in various periods. The Oral Tests were held in two sessions. One in the F.N. and the other in the A.N., A Maximum of 9 Boards were constituted in Both the sessions on some days, 3330 candidates were admitted to Oral Test. Totally 383 sessions took place in 48 days for the current year. The details of Preliminary, Main Written Examination and Oral Examinations conducted are given in Annexure-V.

5. CONCURRENCE UNDER RULES 20(A) (III) OF THE SPECIAL RULES FOR THE TAMIL NADU MINISTERIAL SERVICE:

The Commission accorded its consent under the provision in Rule 20(a)(iii) of the Special Rules of Tamil Nadu Ministerial Services for the permanent transfer of 211 personnel from one departmental unit to another departmental unit within the Tamil Nadu Ministerial Service and in 17 cases consent was refused.

6. PROMULGATION AND AMENDMENTS:

During the period under report there were 92 cases of issue of statutory rules or amendments to them by the Government. Of them in respect of 85 cases the Commission was consulted before the rules were issued and in 7 cases the Commission was not consulted. However, these cases relate either to posts excluded from the purview of the Commission or to matters in respect of which under Article 320 (3) of the Constitution of India, consultation with the Commission is not necessary.

7. RELAXATION:

During the period under report there were 121 cases in which statutory rules relating to age and educational qualifications as the case may be were relaxed by the Government. In no cases, orders of relaxation were issued by the Government in respect of pension matters. In no cases orders of relaxation were issued in respect of certain provisions of the fundamental rules, Tamil Nadu Special Pay and Allowance Rules and the Tamil Nadu Travelling Allowance Rules. In no cases orders of relaxation were issued by the Government in respect of certain provision of the General Provident Fund (Madras) Rules.

SECTION V

OTHER THAN RECRUITMENT EXAMINATIONS

1. DEPARTMENTAL EXAMINATION:

The Departmental Tests were conducted in May and December 1997. The Total number of tests conducted were 258 and the number of candidates applied to the tests were 1,12,151. The details are given below:—

II. HALF YEARLY EXAMINATION:

48 and 50 candidates respectively appeared in the September 1997 and March 1998, Half Yearly Examination including First Class Language Test in Tamil conducted for assistant Collectors, Police Officers and Forest Officers.

III. PROFICIENCY TEST IN TAMIL:

The Commission issued notification in September 1997 inviting applications for proficiency test in Tamil for All India Service Officers whose mother tongue is not Tamil. None of them applied this examination.

IV. RASHTRIYA INDIAN MILITARY COLLEGE SCHOOL, DEHRA DUN EXAMINATION:

The Commission conducted the Examination on behalf of the Government of India, Ministry of Defence in August 1997 and in February 1998 for selection of candidates for admission to Rashtriya Indian Military College School in Dehra Dun. 196 and 132 candidates respectively appeared for the examination. One candidate was selected in August 1997 examination and results are awaited for the Examination held in February 1998.

SECTION VI

A. NON ACCEPTANCE OF COMMISSION ADVICE:

During the year under report, the Government have deviated in 8 cases from the Commission's advice. The details are as follows:-

Case No:1.

During October 1995 the Government in the Health and Family Welfare Department sought the views of the Commission on the appeal preferred by an Assistant professor of medicine, Tirunelveli Medical College against the award of Censure for his having over stayed abroad during 1988 without proper order of the Government for which charges Under Rule 17(a) of Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Disciplinary and Appeal) Rules were framed against him. The Commission examined the case and advised the Government to issue orders to set aside the punishment of censure imposed on the appellant and to exonerate him from the charge, as he has taken all the steps to get the orders of the Government for the extension of deputation period at Libya.

But the Government have issued orders in the G.O. (D) No.1418, Health and Family Welfare Department, dated 16-10-96 rejecting the appeal preferred by the appellant stating that the punishment of "Censure" imposed on the appellant is not excessive when compared to the lapses committed by him. The Government have also stated that the appellant had failed to obtain extension of time from the appropriate authority. The period from 20-6-1987 to 13-7-1988 had been treated as non duty in view of his over stayed.

The Assistant Professor in his appeal had represented that the Government of Libya Insisted a minimum contract period of 2 years for the doctors and there is no, one year contract at Libya. Therefore he had no option but to apply to the Government of Tamil Nadu for the extension of 2nd year deputation. He had also represented the fact by registered letters to the Overseas Manpower Corporation on 31-3-1987 to Director of medical Education on 11-4-87 and to Secretary, Health Department, Government of Tamil Nadu on 31-3-1987 from Libya and also sent registered letter to Health Secretary on 2-4-1987 through Indian Embassy at Tripoli, Libya. He also contacted the Indian Embassy at Libya and explained the position. In addition the Government of Libya gave telex massage to the Government of Tamil Nadu requesting the Chief Minister for an extension of service for the second year vide telex No.600004, Telex No.8-182-87 from the Secretary to Health Alkhom, Libya to the OMCL Madras and sent a letter the the Secretary, Health, Government of Tamil Nadu requesting for sparing of his service through the Secretariat, for a period of one year beyond the period already sanctioned, on 2-4-1987. He has also stated that Government of Libya had refused to issue 'exit Visa' before the completion of minimum contract Period of two years.

He did not get any reply from the Director of Medical Education of Secretary to Health, Government of Tamil Nadu. The Overseas manpower Corporation Limited wanted him to pay 150 U.S. dollars for the Second year on deputation which was paid by him promptly. The Assistant Professor had taken up all the possible steps to act according to the instructions given in para 9 of G.O. Ms. No.2211, Health, dated 16-11-1988. Therefore the Commission advised the Government to accept the appeal preferred by the appellant and to set aside the punishment of 'Censure'. The Government, after considering the above views of the Commission, took the stand that merely applying for extension of deputation and staying away abroad cannot be construed as if the Government had approved his extension of deputation. The appellant should have returned in time and joined in Tamil Nadu Medical Service on expiry of the deputation period. Having not done so amounts to disobedience of orders of Government. Therefore the Government sought the (Revised) views of the Commission in the matter. The Commission once again went through the records in the light of the above observation of the Government at length and reiterated its views already offered and informed the Government accordingly. The Government not accepting the Commission's views issued orders deviating from the Commission views and rejected the appeal preferred by the Assistant Professor which is a clear case of deviation from the Commission's view.

Case No.2:

In September 1994, the Government in Adi-Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Department had sent a proposal to exclude the posts of P.G. Assistants (Subject and Language Teachers) and Physical Education Directors and Directoress to Higher Secondary Schools in Tamil Nadu Adi-Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Higher Secondary Educational Service from the purview of the Commission and to bring them under the purview of "Teachers Recruitment Board" as was done in the case of the similar posts in the Tamil Nadu Higher Secondary Educational Service for the reason that the concessions/ orders issued by the Education Department are being made applicable to the Adi-dravidar and Tribal Welfare Schools also. The Commission after careful consideration did not agree with the Government's proposal for the reason that when there is an expert body created under the constitution to be incharge of selection of candidates, for appointment to the posts in the various services under the Government with the twin object of ensuring impartiality and freeing the Government from the embarrassment of making selection by their offices, it would be inappropriate to exclude those posts from the Commission's purview for no apparent and valid reasons, and the views to that effect were communicated to Government. However, the Government have issued orders in G.O.No.34, Adi-dravidar and Tribal Welfare, dated 25-2-1997 taking away the post of P.G. Assistants (Subject Teachers and Language Teachers) and Physical Education Directors and Woman Directoress in Tamil Nadu Adi-Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Higher Secondary Educational Service from the purview of the Commission. In the Commission's opinion, the decision, taken by the Government excluding the posts referred to above from its purview has violated their own instructions issued in this regard.

Case NO.3 G.O. (Two Ten Years) No.127, Rural Development (E5) Department, Dated 3-6-1997.

Under latter part of Regulation 16(b) of the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission regulation 1954, the Government in their letter, dated 27-2-1997 sought for the concurrence of the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission for the regular appointment Tmt. N. Muthulakshmi, w/o. (late) Thiru V. Nagarajan expired while in service as H.M., in the

Panchayat Union Middle School, Alangudi in Pudukkottai District on Compassionate Grounds for the post of Junior Assistant with effect from 14-5-1987. The Commission took the subject for discussion and before according its concurrence on the above subject, the Government in G.O.(Two Ten Years) No.127, Rural Development (E5) Department, dated 3-6-1997 have issued orders regularising the services Tmt. N. Muthulakshmi in the post of Junior Assistant with effect from 14-5-1987.

Regularisation of Compassionate Grounds appointments made on temporary basis comes under the purview of the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission, Prior concurrence of the Commission is to be obtained. But in this case before getting the concurrence of the commission the Government have issued orders regularising the services of the individual. This is in violation of the rules.

Case No.4:

During August 1994, the Government in the Health and Family Welfare Department sought the views of the Commission on the appeal of Tmt. Nazini Begum, Social Worker Formerly at Stantley Hospital, against the orders of dismissal from service imposed by the Director of Medical Education, Chennai.

The Commission in the course of examining the case had pointed out the following defects in its letter, dated 10-10-1994.

"The charges were framed Under Rule 17(b) of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Discipline and Appeal) rules and imposed the punishment of dismissal from service on the appellant. According to this rule if any of the major penalty is imposed, an oral enquiry should be conducted. But in this case no such enquiry was conducted after framing charges. The appellant opted for personal hearing only. The Enquiry Officer conducted a personal hearing on the appellant and recorded her statement on 21-12-1990. Subsequently on 7-2-1991, the Enquiry Officer conducted on enquiry on two other complainants viz. Md. Nasaraddin and Syed Illiyas in which the appellant was not enquired. Therefore she has not been given the opportunity to cross examine the witnesses. According to para 6 (2) of Chapter III Under Part II Hand Book on disciplinary procedures, the witnesses examined at the preliminary enquiry held before framing of charges whose evidences is considered necessary to prove the charges must be recalled at the regular enquiry after the charges have been framed. The first complainant Thiru. Abibullah was not examined by the Enquiry Officer after the Charges were framed against the appellant. Further the Enquiry Officer has taken the facts arrived at the preliminary enquiry while drawing the enquiry report. The above said defects vitiate the disciplinary action taken against the appellant.

The commission therefore, advised the Government to set aside the final orders of Director of Medical Education and to start fresh proceedings from the stage at which the defects had crept in".

The Government have **new** issued order in G.O.(D) No.246, Health and Family Welfare, dated 23-2-1996 by deviating from the views of the Commission to reject the appeal preferred by the appellant. The Government have relied upon the following reasons for deviating from the Commission's advice:

"Tmt. Nazini Begum has committed the grave offence of cheating the Public, Corruption, forgering other man's signature and misusing the Hospital Seal. She does not deserve any sympathy, Moreover it will be prejudicial to the administration. Therefore, the Government have decided to reject the appeal of Tmt. Nazini Begum".

Case No.5:

During August' 96, the Government in the Health and Family Welfare Department, Sought the views of the Commission and the disciplinary action taken against a Tutor in Accident and Emergency Ward and duty ortho Surgeon, Tirunelveli Medical College, Tirunelveli by framing three charges under rule 17(b) of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Disciplinary & Appeal) Rules for his dereliction of duty etc.

The Enquiry Officer held charge 1 as partially proved and charges 2 and 3 as not proved but the Government held the charges 2 and 3 also as proved and sought for the views of the Commission. The Commission examined the case and advised the Government in February '97 to impose on the Delinquent Officer the punishment of stoppage of increment for three years with cumulative effect (affecting his pension inclusive of the period spent on leave) for the proven charges.

But the Government have issued orders in G.O.Ms.No.986, Health and Family Welfare Department, dated 7-8-1997. Imposing the Punishment of compulsory retirement from service. The Government have thus issued orders deviating

from the Commission's advice. The Government have relied upon the following three points for deviating from the Commission's advice:-

- (1) That the Delinquent Officer caused the death of a patient due to his sheer negligence.
- (2) That professional apathy as exhibited by his action cannot be viewed lightly. Only a deterrent punishment will serve as a warning to others besides being adequate to the gravity of the offence committed by him.
- (3) That the National Human Rights Commission is viewing such cases seriously and the Government is forced to pay compensation to the families of victims.

The circumstances and nature of the case warranted only a lesser punishment as stoppage of increment with cumulative effect. Keeping this in view, the Commission advised the Government to impose the punishment of stoppage of increment for three years with cumulative effect on the Delinquent Officer. But the Government have issued orders deviating from the Commission's advice.

Case No.6:

During February, 1997 the Government in Home (S.C) Department, sought the views of the Commission on the Review Petition preferred by a formerly Divisional Fire Officer, Palayamkottai against the punishment of stoppage of increment for a period of two years with cumulative effect.

The Commission examined the Review Petition, came to the conclusion that the Punishment already imposed is on the high side and it is likely to affect his pensionary benefits too much and advised the Government to reduce the punishment into one of stoppage of increment for one year with cumulative effect which will also affect his pension.

But the Government have issued orders in G.O.2 (D) No.246, Home (S.C) Department, dated 27-10-1997 rejecting the Review petition preferred by Thiru. S. Raja stating that the Government is of the view that considering the seriousness of the charges, the punishment of stoppage of increment for two years with cumulative effect imposed on the Review Petitioner is moderate and further reduction in the punishment is not justified that too merely on the ground that his petision will be affected. The Government have thus issued orders deviating from the Commission's views.

Case No:7:

During September'93, the Government in the Health and Family Welfare Department sought the views of the Commission on the petition preferred by a Medical Officer, formerly working at Government Hospital, Third degree against the punishment of stoppage of increment for two years with cumulative effect imposed on him by the Government for the offence committed by him.

The Commission examined the case and advised the Government in April, 1994 that the punishment of stoppings of increment for 2 years with cumulative effect already awarded by the Government could be considered as hard-and excessive which might be modified as stoppage of increment for three months without cumulative effect.

After obtaining the views of the Commission, the Government in their letter, dated 18-8-1994 had required to Commission to treat the views sought for in the matter by the Government on the petition as withdrawn in view of the fact that the punishment of stoppage of increment for two years with cumulative effect was imposed in G.O.Ms.No.507. Health, dated 4-4-1991 on the Medical Officer which commensurates with the gravity of offence committed by him and issued orders in G.O.(D) No.679, Health and Family Welfare Department, dated 22-8-1994 rejecting the petition fided by the Medical Officer as devoid of merits. The Government have not mentioned any correspondence between the Government and the Tamil Nadu Public service Commission in the body of the above G.O. The Government have not also mentioned any thing regarding the views of the Commission in the G.O. The Government have relied upon the following points for deviating from the Commission's advice:—

- 1. The Appeal preferred by the petitioner in this case is not a statutory petition in view of the reasons stated in the petition.
- 2. As the petition is not a statutory one, there is no need to modify the punishment already imposed on him which commensurates with the gravity of the offence committed by him.
- 3. The commission was informed about the decision of the Government to reject the petition preferred by the Petitioner and also the views already sought for in the matter may be treated as withdrawn.

4. In view of the above reasons, the question of deviation from the views of the Commission or rurnisning the letter containing the views of the Commission to the petitioner as required in rule 19 of Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission Rules of procedure does not arise.

Only after having examined the case thoroughly on its merits, the Commission had advised the Government to modify the punishment of stoppage of increment for two years with cumulative effect already imposed on the petitioner into one of stoppage of increment for three months without cumulative effect. It is open to the Government to pass orders either accepting the advice or deviating from the advice tendered by the Commission on the disciplinary matters referred to it by the Government for the views. But in the instant case, the Government had not accepted the views of the Commission and issued orders rejecting the petition. The copy of letter containing the views of the Commission was not also communicated to the petitioner along with the G.O. When the Commission enquired the reason from the Government for non-communication of the Commission's views to the petitioner, the Government replied that the views sought for in the matter in the Government letter might be treated as withdrawn. The stand taken by the Government to treat the Government's letter seeking the Commission's views on the petition as withdrawn is not an acceptable one after obtaining the views of the Commission in the matter. The Commission also considers that this act is contrary to the Art. 320 (3) (c) of the Constitution.

Case No.8:

During July '96, the Government sought the views of the Commission as to the orders to be passed on the disciplinary action taken against an Assistant Surgeon attached to the Government Hospital, Tiruchendur and an Assistant Surgeon attached to Post Partum Programme, Government Head-Quarters Hospital, Tuticorin for their careless treatment in sterilisation operations which resulted in the death of three patients. The Commission examined the case in detail. In the case of the first delinquent Officer the Commission found that the delinquent officer could not be made fully responsible for the death of the patient and other doctors are also collectively responsible for this. The Commission felt that considering the circumstances of the case and the age (39 years) and service put in by the delinquent Officer (7 years) imposition of the punishment viz., reduction of pay to the bottom in the time scale in the post of the Assistant Surgeon for a period of five years on the delinquent officer would be adequate. The commission accordingly advised the Government to issue orders to impose the said punishment of reducation of the pay to the bottom in the time scale in the post of Assistant Surgeon for a period of five years with cumulative effect on the delinquent officer.

In the case of the Second delinquent officer the Commission found that a sum of Rs.1 lakh had been ordered to be recovered from the delinquent officer to make good the loss caused to the Government by way of paying compensation of Rs.1 lakh to the family of the deceased following the recommendation of the National Human Rights Commission. The Commission observed that before implementing the order of recovery, the issue should have been made a part of disciplinary action taken against the delinquent officer and then the order of recovery should have been passed and that due to this failure a flaw had occurred in the case. The Commission, therefore, advised the Government to restart the disciplinary proceedings from the stage where the said flaw had crept in, pursue the case and then refer the case to it (Commission) for its views.

But the Government did not accept the above views of the Commission in the two cases. The Government disposed of the cases by imposing the punishment of 'removal from service' on each of the delinquent officers *vide* G.O. (D) No.22, Health and Family Welfare dated 6-1-1998 and in G.O.(D) No.23, Health and Family Welfare, dated 6-1-1998 in deviation of the Commission's views. The Government put forth the following point for deviating from the Commission's advice:-

The injury to bowel in the patient's body was very clear but the first delinquent officer failed to detect the injury. The charge is proved beyond doubt. For the proved charge, removing the delinquent officer will be the apt punishment.

As regards second delinquent officer, recovery of compensation amount from her has nothing to do with the penalty to be awarded on her for the proved charges. There is no procedural flaw in the disciplinary proceedings taken in this case.

Moreover, the delinquent officer has already filed an original application in Tamil Nadu Administrative Tribunal challenging the orders issued for the recovery. As the question of recovery from the delinquent officer ordered therein is sub judice there is no need to restart disciplinary proceedings incorporating the question of recovery from the delinquent as a part of the charge, as suggested by the Commission.

The circumstances of the case which first delinquent officer had been involved mitigated the gravity of the lapse committed by her and this naturally called for imposition of only a lesser punishment. Keeping this in view the Commission advised the Government to impose the punishment of "reduction of pay to the bottom in the time scale" in the post of Assistant surgeon for a period of five years with cumulative effect on the first delinquent officer. As regards the second delinquent officer, recovery of Rs.1 lakh should have been made only after making the issue a part of the charges thereby affording opportunity to defend her case. Keeping this in view the Commission advised to start fresh disciplinary proceedings in her case. But the Government issued orders in both the cases deviating from the Commission's advice.

C. The details of the member of cases in which the Government have not accepted the Commission's advice and the number of cases in which Government have not consulted the Commission are given for the latest five years in Annexure-XI.
