SECTION - I

FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES

The Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission has to discharge the duties and functions specified in article 320 of the Constitution of India. The Commission is required to advise Government on all matters relating to framing of recruitment rules, principles to be followed in making appointments and promotions and transfers from one service to another service, in respect of disciplinary matters affecting Government Servants and to make direct recruitment to the State, Subordinate and Ministerial Services. The Commission conducts Departmental Examinations for Government Servants and also conducts the examination on behalf of the Government of India, Ministry of Defence for admission to Rashtriya Indian Military College, School Dehra Dun.

10. REFORMS AND RATIONALISATION

The Commission has decided to publish syllabi for all the subjects for recruitment examinations 1)In the Commission's Website 2) In the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission Bulletin and 3)Also to print the syllabi in Booklet form, post/subject wise make available at the Post Office and at the Commission's Office to enable the candidates to purchase the same for their use.

SECTION - II

DIRECT RECRUITMENT:

During the period, the Commission conducted Preliminary Examination in respect of Group-I Services for 74 vacancies 75,158 candidates were admitted to the Preliminary Examination. The Commission conducted Main Written Examination for 23 recruitments consisting of 2,156 vacancies for which 1,86,378 candidates were admitted. The Commission conducted oral examination for 44 recruitments containing 1,270 vacancies and 3,187 candidates were admitted to oral examination. The commission finalised 47 recruitments containing 6,020 vacancies and recommended 5,921 candidates for appointments. The recruitment statistics in respect of 47 recruitments are given in the Annexure - II.

GROUP - SERVICES

GROUP - I SERVICES

- a. The Commission issued notification on 7.1.98 for Group - I Services Examination containing 84 vacancies, against which 67,000 application were received. The Preliminary Examination was held on 07-06-98. 840 candidates were admitted to Main Written Examination. The Main written was held from 14.12.98 to 13.1.99. The Oral test was held on 23.11.99 to 4.12.99. and finally 84 candidates were selected.
- b. The Commission issued notification on 12.12.98 for Group-I Services Examination containing 46 vacancies, against which 46,650 applications were received. The Preliminary Examination was held on 6.6.99. The main written Examination was held on 6.12.99 to 30.12.99. The Oral Test was held on 27-03.-2001 to 31-03-2001. and finally 46 candidates were selected.
- c. The Commission issued notification on 21.12.99 for Group-I Services Examination containing 74 Vacancies against which 75,158 application were received. The preliminary Examination was held on 11.06.2000.

- d. The Commission issued notification on 27.12.2000 for Group-I Services Examination containing 99 Vacancies against which 1,06,650 application were received. The preliminary Examination was held on 10.06.2001.

COMBINED SUBORDINATE SERVICES EXAMINATION-I:

- a. The Commission issued notification on 01-08-98 for Combined Subordinate Service Examination-I consisting of 1617 vacancies. 1,31,719 applications were received. The Main Written Examination was held from 17.5.99 to 19.5.99 and the reexamination was held on 16-12-2000 to 18-12-2000.
- b. The Commission issued notification on 08.07.99 for Combined Subordinate Service Examination-I consisting of 72 vacancies. 23,742 applications were received. The Main Written Examination was held from 23.10.99 to 25.10.99.

COMBINED SUBORDINATE SERVICES EXAMINATION-II:

The Commission issued notification on 8.8.98 for C.S.S.E. - II consisting of 88 vacancies, 45,534 applications were received. The Main Written Examination was held from 08.5.99 to 16.05.99. The Oral Test was held on 21-08-2000 to 31-08-2000 and finally 133 candidates were selected.

GROUP - IV SERVICES

- a. The Commission issued notification on 05-10-98 for recruitment of candidates to 3211 vacancies for the post of Junior Assistant. - cum Typist included in Group IV Services. 4,25,500 applications were received. The Main Written Examination was held on 31-01-99. Finally 3652 candidates were selected.
- b. The Commission issued notification on 07.10.99 for recruitment of candidates to 2153 vacancies for the post of Junior Assistant cum Typist in Group – IV Services 4,05,925 applications were received. The Main Written Examination was held on 06.02.2000. Finally 1,224 candidates were selected.

PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION:

During the period under report the Commission conducted One Preliminary Examination, consisting of 74 vacancies; 75,158 candidates were admitted to Preliminary Examination.

MAIN WRITTEN EXAMINATION:

During the period under report the Commission conducted 24 Main Written Examinations to fill up 2,156 vacancies; 1,86,378 candidates were admitted to these Main Written Examinations.

ORAL EXAMINATION:

During the period under report the Commission conducted Oral Test for 44 Recruitments to fill up 1270 vacancies. The Commission conducted interviews on 64 days in various periods. The Oral Tests were held in two sessions, one in the F.N. and the other in the A.N., a Maximum of 5 Boards were constituted in Both the sessions on some days, 3187 candidates were admitted to Oral Test. Totally 420 sessions took place in 64 days for the current year. The details of Preliminary, Main Written Examination and Oral Examinations conducted are given in Annexure-V.

5. CONCURRENCE UNDER RULES 20(A) (iii) OF THE SPECIAL RULES FOR THE TAMIL NADU MINISTERIAL SERVICE.

The Commission accorded its consent under the provision in Rule 20(a)(iii) of the Special Rules of Tamil Nadu Ministerial Services for the Permanent transfer of 131 Personnel from one departmental unit to another departmental unit within the Tamil Nadu Ministerial Service and in no case consent was refused.

6. PROMULGATION AND AMENDMENTS:

During the period under report there were 56 cases of issue of statutory rules or amendments to them by the Government. Of them in respect of 49 cases the Commission was consulted before the rules were issued and in 7 cases the Commission was not consulted. However, these cases relate either to posts excluded from the purview of the Commission or to matters in respect of which under Article 320(3) of the Constitution of India, consultation with the Commission is not necessary.

7. RELAXATION:

During the period under report there were 70 cases in which statutory rules relating to age and educational qualifications as the case may be were relaxed by the Government. In one case, the Government in respect of pension matters issued orders of relaxation. In no case, orders of relaxation were issued in respect of certain provisions of the fundamental rules, Tamil Nadu Special Pay and Allowance Rules and the Tamil Nadu Travelling Allowance Rules. In no case, orders of relaxation were issued by the Government in respect of certain provision of the General Provident Fund (Madras) Rules.

SECTION - V

I. DEPARTMENTAL EXAMINATION:

The Departmental Tests were conducted in May and December 2000. The Total number of tests conducted were 228 and the number of candidates applied to the tests were 1,13,363. The details are given below:-

II. HALF YEARLY EXAMINATION:

29 and 17 candidates respectively appeared in the September 2000 and March 2001. Half Yearly Examination including First Class Language Test in Tamil conducted for Assistant Collectors, Police Officers and Forest Officers.

III. PROFICIENCY TEST IN TAMIL:

The Commission issued notification in September 2000 inviting applications for proficiency test in Tamil for All India Service Officers whose mother tongue is not Tamil. None of them applied this examination.

IV. RASHTRIYA INDIAN MILITARY COLLEGE SCHOOL, DEHRA DUN EXAMINATION:

The Commission conducted the Examination on behalf of the Government of India, Ministry of Defence in August 2000 and in February 2001 for selection of candidates for admission to Rashtriya Indian Military College School in Dehra Dun 196 and 125 candidates respectively appeared for the examination.

SECTION - VI

A. NON ACCEPTANCE OF COMMISSION'S ADVICE:

During the year under report, the Government have deviated in 1 case from the Commission's advice. The details as follows:

CASE No.1 :

Disciplinary action was initiated against Thiru A. Shanmugavel, Forester of Hosur Range for having incurred loss of Rs.11,670.30 while forming Garden at the range during 1980-81 and 1981-82. Charges were framed against him under Rule 17(b) of the Tamil Nadu civil Services (Discipline and appeal) Rules and that he had submitted his explanation. The Enquiry Officer after conducting the enquiry held the charges as proved. The Government after going through the records of the case along with the Enquiry Officer's report and the further representation on the Enquiry officer's report held the charges as proved and for the proved charges arrived at a provisional conclusion. The Government forwarded the case to the Commission's Office and requested the Commission's views on the case. The Commission after going through the records of the case held the charges as proved and advised the Government for the recovery of Rs.11,670.30 towards the loss caused to the Government and also the punishment of stoppage of increment for a period of three years without cumulative effect.

But the Government have not accepted the Commission's views as the Commission's view was against the provisional conclusion arrived at by the Government and issued orders in G.O. 3(D) No.34 Environment and Forest dt.25-07-2000 by awarding the punishment of recovery of Rs.11670.30 towards loss caused to the Government holding charge 1 as proved and that the Ranger was let off without any other punishment with the intention of not to punish the Forester for the lapses on the part of Ranger. The Government have specifically stated the reasons for deviating for the Commission's views and that the views of the Commission were against the provisional conclusion arrived at by the Government.

MEMORANDUM EXPLAINING THE REASONS FOR DEVIATION FROM THE ADVICE OF TAMIL NADU PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION IN THE CASES REFERRED TO IN SECTION VI-A OF THE ANNUAL REPORT OF THE TAMIL NADU PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION FOR 2001-2002.

Case No.-I

During July' 98, the Government in the Finance (LF) Department sought the views of the Commission on the Petition preferred by a Junior Assistant in the Local Fund Audit Department against the order of the Joint Examiner of Local Fund Audit, Imposing 'Removal' from service on him.

The Commission after examining the case, had communicated the following views in its letter dated 17.04.2000:

"For the charges that are held proved the Petitioner deserves severe Punishment. But taking into consideration of his past 20 years of Government service and since no punishment was imposed on him by the court and by also taking into consideration that there are only 5 more years of service for retirement, with sympathetic view the Commission advised the Government to reduce the punishment of 'removal' from service into that of reduction of pay in the time scale of pay of Rs.3200-85-4900/- to the minimum of Rs.3200/- for four years exclusive of any leave and to set right his pay after the said period is over and to issue order that it would not affect his future increment". But the Government have now issued orders in G.O. (2D) No.8, Finance (LF) dated 8.03.2001 deviating from the views of the Commission and have relied upon the following points for deviation:

" Though the charges framed against the Petitioner are proved for violation of Government Servants conduct Rules, taking into consideration of his 20 years of Government Service, on humanitarian grounds the punishment of removal already imposed on the petitioner be reduced to one of compulsory retirement for pensionary benefits".

THE FACTORS THAT PROMPTED THE GOVERNMENT TO ISSUE AN ORDER AGAINST THE ADVICE OF THE COMMISSION ARE DETAILED BELOW:-

Thiru G. Christopher Gnanamanickam, formerly Junior Assistant, in Local Fund Audit Department was arrested by the Police and a case was registered against him for the reason that he misbehaved in the office in the drunken state. Further, disciplinary action under Rule 17(b) was initiated against him and punishment of Removal from service was awarded by the Joint Director of Local Fund Audit Department. Thiru G. Christopher Gnanamanickam preferred an appeal against this punishment with the Director of Local Fund Audit who in turn confirmed the above punishment.

Again the individual had preferred an appeal against this punishment with the Government. While examining this case, the Government sought the advice of the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission. The Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission in turn suggested to reduce the punishment of "Removal from Service", reinstate in the post of Junior Assistant, and to fix the pay in the minimum in the scale of pay of Rs.3200-85-4900. Though the Government viewed this case seriously, have decided to take a lenient view after taking into consideration of the 20 years of Government Service rendered by him and on humanitarian grounds, after obtaining orders in Circulation upto Hon'ble Chief Minister, have reduced the punishment of "Removal from Service" as Compulsory Retirement", so that the individual may get all the pensionary benefits. This position was informed to the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission separately in Government Letter No.66472/LF/96, dated 8.3.2001.

Case No.-II

During October 1999, the Government in the Commercial Taxes Department, sought the views of the Commission on the appeal preferred by Thiru T. Nagarajan formerly Deputy Commercial Tax Officer against the punishment of stoppage of increment for one year without cumulative effect, imposed on him by the Special Commissioner and Commissioner of Commercial Taxes, Chennai for the reason that Thiru T. Nagarajan (Appellant) was responsible for the delayed remittance of Government money in the State Bank or in Treasury, for the missing of receipt and also for the failure to make necessary entries in the cash book regarding the collection of 'C' fees in time. The Commission, examined the appeal with connected records and opined that the lapses one and two levelled against the appellant as not proved and for the proved third lapse, the punishment imposed on the appellant is on the higher side considering the services rendered by him. The Commission therefore advised the Government that it is proper and just ,to modify the punishment as stoppage of increment for three months without cumulative effect. The Government had stated that the appellant has not adduced any fresh ground for consideration. Even as per the views of the Commission the third lapse is proved. Taking into account the gravity of the lapses proved, the punishment of stoppage of increment for three months without cumulative effect suggested by the Commission is considered to be very low. For the said reasons, the Government decided to deviate from the views of the Commission and modified the punishment into stoppage of increment for six months without cumulative effect. Accordingly the Government have issued orders in G.O. 2D No. 70 Commercial Taxes dated 11.4.2001.

THE FACTORS THAT PROMPTED THE GOVERNMENT TO ISSUE AN ORDER AGAINST THE ADVICE OF THE COMMISSION ARE DETAILED BELOW:-

In this case there is no procedural irregularity. The appellant has not adduced any fresh grounds for consideration. Even as per the views of the Commission the third lapse is proved. Taking into account the gravity of the lapses proved, the punishment of stoppage of increment for three months without cumulative effect recommended by the Commission was considered to be very low. For the above reasons, the Government have deviated from the views of the Commission and modified the punishment into stoppage of increment for six months without cumulative effect, in their orders issued in G.O.2D No.70, Commercial Taxes Department, dated 11.4.2001.

Case No.-III

During March 1998, the Government in the Co-operation, Food and Consumer Protection Department sought the views of the Commission on the disciplinary action taken against the Deputy Registrar of Co-operative Societies for certain delinquencies under Regulation 18(1) (b) of the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission Regulations, 1954. The Scrutiny of the case revealed that two set of charges were framed against the delinquent officer. In the first set of charges, the Registrar of Co-operative Societies framed charges for the delinquencies committed by the Delinquent officer while he was working as a Special Officer Kanniyakumari Central Co-operative Bank under Rule 17(b) of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Discipline and Appeal) Rules. Based on the report of an appropriate enquiry authority another set of 7 charges under Rule 17(b) of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Discipline and Appeal) Rules were framed against the delinquent Officer by the Registrar Co-operative Societies for the lapses committed while he was working as Deputy Registrar/Special Officer, Nilgiris Co-operative Marketing Society and the delinquent officer was not allowed to retire from service on attaining the age of superannuation on 31.08.96 A.N. but was placed under suspension. The explanation from the delinquent officer was received and an enquiry was conducted. The Enquiry officer's report was communicated to the delinquent officer and his further representation was obtained.

The Government have examined the case in detail and arrived at a Provisional conclusion to remove him from service for the charges held proved and have sought the views of the Commission as to the orders to be passed in this case.

The Commission in November 1999 after examining the case in depth had advised the Government to impose the punishment of compulsory retirement considering the 36 years of service put up by the delinquent officer.

In February 2001, the Government in G.O. Ms. No.40, Co-operation, Food and Consumer Protection Department, dated 15.02.2001 issued orders, deviating from the Commission's advice by imposing the punishment of removal from service on the delinquent Officer.

THE FACTORS THAT PROMPTED THE GOVERNMENT TO ISSUE AN ORDER AGAINST THE ADVICE OF THE COMMISSION ARE DETAILED BELOW:-

As orders of suspension, removal or dismissal from service cannot be imposed retrospectively, the above punishment suggested by the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission that too after expressing the view that the charges which are framed are serious in nature and which requires deterrent punishment appears to be not a punishment at all, as it will not have any effect on the Delinquent Officer and he will get all his terminal benefits. It was proposed to address the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission for reconsidering its views. But, when the file was sent to Personnel and Administrative Reforms Department for its remarks, that Department opined that if the views of the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission is not acceptable by the Department, then the appointing authority can deviate from the advice of the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission and take a final decision for confirmation of provisional conclusion already taken and the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission need not be consulted again and to take a decision by deviating from the views of Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission, orders in circulation including Chief Minister will have to be obtained under rule 35(1)(a)(XXXIV) of the Tamil Nadu Government Business Rules. Considering the gravity of charges and the loss caused by the individual, Co-operation, Food and Consumer Protection Department decided to confirm the provisional conclusion of removal of service and after obtaining orders in circulation up to Hon'ble Chief Minister, orders were issued in G.O.Ms.No.40, Co-operation, Food and Consumer Protection Department dated 15.2.2001 for removing the individual from the Government service.

Case No.-IV

Disciplinary action was initiated against Selvi. R Ramabai, formerly Staff Nurse at Arignar Anna Memorial Cancer Institute, Karapettai, Kancheepuram on 24.05.95 under Rule 17 (b) of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Discipline & Appeal) Rules for her unauthorized absence from duty and her failure to furnish correct address to send tappals addressed to her. During the year 1997, the Director of Medical Education had issued orders, removing the nurse from service. Consequent on her appeal against the punishment of 'removal' to the Government, the Government had sought the views of the Commission in the year 1998. As the punishment of 'removal from Service' was so harsh and as the appellant had hardly three years of service before retirement, the Commission advised the Government to impose the punishment of stoppage of increment for three years with cumulative effect against her, in relaxation to the rule 18 (3) of fundamental Rules. The Government, contrary to the advice tendered by the Commission, issued orders in G.O (D) No: 939 Health and Family Welfare dated 11.7.2001 modifying the punishment of removal into one of "Compulsory retirement" on 11.07.2001.

THE FACTORS THAT PROMPTED THE GOVERNMENT TO ISSUE AN ORDER AGAINST THE ADVICE OF THE COMMISSION ARE DETAILED BELOW:-

While examining the case, it was noticed that the date of superannuation of the individual was on 30.4.2001 and the punishment suggested by the Commission, could not be implemented fully. In the meantime, the Government have issued instructions in Government Letter No.68841/FR.III/98-6, Personnel and Administrative Reforms Department, dated 8.6.1999 that no final orders should be issued in the disciplinary case initiated against the public servants for unauthorised absence, till the disposal of the Original Applications pending before the Tribunal. Later, the Hon'ble Tribunal has declared that the FR 18(3) is not valid. Based on the orders of the Hon'ble Tribunal in this regard, the Government have issued instructions in G.O.Ms.No.153, P&AR Department, dated 8.8.2000. Accordingly, the Government have decided to process the instant case. The punishment of stoppage of increment for three years with cumulative effect as advised by the Commission could not be imposed on the individual as it could not be implemented in view of the fact that the appellant has reached her date of superannuation on 30.4.2001. As such, even the punishment of stoppage of increment for one year also could not be imposed on the individual. Hence, the Government have decided to deviate from the views of the Commission and to impose the punishment of Compulsory Retirement on Selvi. R. Ramabai, Nurse formerly at Government Arignar Anna Memorial Cancer Hospital, Karapettai, Kancheepuram. Accordingly, orders were issued in G.O. (D) No.939, Health and Family Welfare Department, dated 11.7.01.

Case No.-V

During the month of August 94, the Government in the Education, Science and Technology Department, sought the views of the Commission on the petition preferred by Tmt. P Chinnathai, formerly Assistant Teacher in the Panchayat Union Elementary School against the order of the District Educational officer imposing on her the punishment of removal from service.

The Commission in course of examining the case, had communicated the following views in its letter dated 6.12.94:

"The Commission has perused the records. In this case, the petitioner in her letter dated 10.8.89, has requested the District Educational Officer to allow her to join duty. But, the action of the District Educational Officer, in not allowing her to join duty and also initiated disciplinary action against her, is against the rules. Further, two charges were framed against the petitioner. In the charge memo, it has not been stated under which rules of Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Classification, Control and Appeal) rules, the charges were framed against her. She was also not asked to state, whether she desires for an oral enquiry or personal hearing or both.

The procedure prescribed under rule 18(c) of Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Classification, Control and Appeal) has not been followed in order to serve the charge memo to the petitioner. The petitioner has not attended the enquiry. Therefore, before issuing final orders, an exparte enquiry should have been conducted and the copy of exparte enquiry report should have been communicated to the petitioner as per rule 17 (b) (ii) of Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Discipline and Appeal) rule and her further representation should have been obtained. But in this case, the said procedures have not been followed.

Further, in any case, the punishment orders will not be given retrospective effect. In this case, the District Educational Officer, in his final orders dated 11.4.90, has ordered to remove the petitioner from service from 4.7.87 onwards. This is against the rule 54(8) of F.R.

In view of the above defects, the disciplinary case initiated against the petitioner runs into procedural flaw. Therefore, the Commission advised the Government to set aside the defective final orders and to continue the disciplinary procedures under rule 9 of Tamil Nadu Pension Rules.

But the Government have issued orders in G.O. 714 dated 3.10.96, deviating from the views of the Commission and have relied upon the following points for deviation.

The Government have examined the above suggestions of Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission. The Government felt that it is doubtful that whether a fresh proceedings under Pension Rules for the unauthorised absence could be instituted against her at that stage, after permitting her to retire on 30.4.1990, and that if at all, it is instituted, definitely the codified punishment of removal from service cannot be imposed on the delinquent officer. Further, the individual has to be paid provisional pension from 1-5-90 onwards, besides treating non-duty period as duty. Fresh charges under rule 17(b) of Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Discipline and Appeal) Rules also cannot be instituted as she had attained the age of superannuation on 30.4.90.

In the above circumstances, Government have decided to deviate from the views of Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission and decided not to initiate any disciplinary proceedings against the individual as she has already attained the age of Superannuation on 30.04.90 and to allow normal retirement of Tmt. Chinnathai with effect from 30.04.90 by setting aside the orders of removal of Tmt. P. Chinnathai Passed by the District Educational Officer, Periakulam, Madurai District.

THE FACTORS THAT PROMPTED THE GOVERNMENT TO ISSUE AN ORDER AGAINST THE ADVICE OF THE COMMISSION ARE DETAILED BELOW:-

As the individual had attained the age of superannuation on 30.4.90 and the four year limitation to initiate disciplinary action from the date of offence committed, under Tamil Nadu Pension Rules and no orders were issued retaining time under FR 56(1)(c) beyond the date of superannuation, no fresh charge could be issued under rule 17(b) of Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Disciplinary and Appeal) Rules, Education department had proposed to deviate from the views of Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission. The whole issue of absence of the individual was examined. Under ruling (3) under FR 9(6)(b), if an individual reports for duty and made to wait for posting, the period of wait from the date of postings to the date of the receipt of posting order, has to be regulated as "Compulsory Wait" and that in the instant case the individual was stated to be not allowed to join duty after 11.8.89, and that as soon as the individual has reported for duty after the expiry of leave applied for, she should have been allowed for duty. There is no provision enabling the Office to refuse her from joining duty and thereby preventing her from attending office is on the part of the Officer concerned for which the individual could not be held responsible. In the circumstances, she was allowed normal retirement with effect from 30.4.90 treating the period from 20.8.87 to 10.8.89 as Extra-ordinary Leave without allowance and the period of compulsory wait from 11.8.89 to 30.4.90 as on duty after obtaining the concurrence of Personnel and Administrative Reforms and Law Departments and obtaining orders in Circulation upto Chief Minister.

Case No.-VI

During January 2000 the Government in the Commercial Taxes Department, sought the views of the Commission on the appeal preferred by Thiru. S.A. Md. Asraf Ali, Sub-Registrar, Thiruchitrambalam Sub-Registrar's Office, against the punishment of stoppage of increment for two years without cumulative effect imposed by the Inspector General of Registration. The Commission examined the case and advised the Government in August'

2000 that the punishment already imposed may be reduced to stoppage of increment for six months without cumulative effect.

But the Government issued orders in G.O. (2D) No.61, Commercial Taxes (H2) Department, dt. 4.4.2001 by confirming the punishment already imposed on the appellant.

The Government have relied upon the following points for deviating from the Commission's advice:-

1. The appellant admitted the Office Asst. for remitting the huge amount of Rs. 30, 711/- into SBI of Pudukkottai, though a standing order exist that the huge amount should be remitted in bank by Assistant.

2. The Bank chalan given for which the amount has been remitted into the bank was obtained from time to time, the salary arrears of the employees amounting to Rs. 8717/- would not have been misappropriated by the office assistant.

The circumstances and nature of the case warranted only a lesser punishment of stoppage of increment for 6 months without cumulative effect and keeping this in view the Commission advised the Government accordingly. But the Government have issued orders deviating from the Commission's advice.

THE FACTORS THAT PROMPTED THE GOVERNMENT TO ISSUE AN ORDER AGAINST THE ADVICE OF THE COMMISSION ARE DETAILED BELOW:-

As per Standing Order 1523(a) of the Registration Department, Office Assistants should not be allowed to carry more than Rs.10000/- for remittance. But Thiru Mohammed Asraf Ali, Sub- Registrar, Thiruchitrabalam has allowed the Office Assistant Thiru Radhakrishnan for remittance of Rs.30,711/- in violation of the Standing Order. His explanation that Thiru C. Pakkirisamy, Junior Assistant, who had been transferred from Thanjavur Registration District, was new to the Office on whom he did not have confidence could not be accepted as Thiru C. Pakkirisamy was not new to the Office in that area in view of the fact that he had already worked in Papanasam Sub- Registrar Office earlier. He should have asked Thiru C. Pakkirisamy, Junior Assistant to accompany Thiru Radhakrishnan, Office Assistant for remittance of Government money. Because of his action in sending the Office Assistant in defiance of the Standing Orders of the Inspector General of Registration there was mis-appropriation of Government money of Rs.8,717/-

Secondly, the wife of Thiru Radhakrishnan, Office Assistant informed that her husband spent the amount of Rs.8717/- drawn from the bank and due to shyness he did not attend office. Though the amount was remitted on 8.9.97, by his relative Thiru Selvaraj, it is proved that the Office Assistant has misappropriated the Government money. If Thiru Mohammed Asraf Ali had insisted for the chalan for remittance of the amount then and there, such misappropriation would not have taken place.

For the reasons stated above, the views of Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission to reduce the punishment of stoppage of increment for two years awarded to Thiru Mohammed Asraf Ali, Sub-Registrar into that of stoppage of increment for six months without cumulative effect was not accepted and in deviation of the Commission's views, the appeal of Thiru Mohammed Asraf Ali, Sub-Registrar was rejected and the punishment awarded by the Inspector General of Registration was confirmed.

Case No.- VII

During December 1999 the Government in the Commercial Taxes Department, sought the views of the Commission on appeal preferred by Thiru. T.P. Madheswaran, Commercial Tax Officer, Chennai (North) Division against the punishment of stoppage of increment for a period of 1 year without cumulative effect imposed by Special Commissioner and Commissioner of Commercial Taxes Department for failure on the part of the appellant to rectify the audit defect and the submission of incorrect taxable turnover in the counter affidavit. The Commission examined the case thoroughly and advised the Government in August' 2000 that the punishment of stoppage of increment for 1 year without cumulative effect might be reduced into one of stoppage of increment for 6 months without cumulative effect.

The Government have issued orders in G.O. (2D) No. 55, Commercial Taxes Department, dt. 2.4.2001 rejecting the appeal and confirmed the punishment already imposed on the appellant.

The Government have relied upon the following points for deviating from the Commission's advice:-

The appellant has not adduced any fresh grounds in his appeal and the punishment already awarded is not disproportionately harsh and therefore decided to confirm the punishment of stoppage of increment for one year without cumulative effect already imposed on the appellant and rejected the appeal as devoid of merits.

The circumstances and nature of the case did not warrant the above said punishment and keeping this in view, the Commission advised the Government that the punishment of stoppage of increment for one year might be reduced into one of stoppage of increment for 6 months without cumulative effect. But the Government have issued orders deviating from the views offered by the Commission.

THE FACTORS THAT PROMPTED THE GOVERNMENT TO ISSUE AN ORDER AGAINST THE ADVICE OF THE COMMISSION ARE DETAILED BELOW:-

In this case, there is no procedural flaw. The appellant has not adduced any fresh grounds for reducing the punishment. The Government also considered that the punishment of stoppage of increment for one year without cumulative effect is not disproportionately harsh when compared to the proven lapse committed by him. For the above reasons, the Government have deviated from the views of the Commission and to confirm the punishment already imposed on the appellant. Accordingly, orders have been issued in G.O. (2D) No.55,C.T. Department, dated 2.4.2001 rejecting the appeal of Thiru T.P. Madeswaran, C.T.O. as devoid of merits.

Case No.-VIII

During 1997, the Government in Health and Family Welfare Department, sought the views of the Commission on the disciplinary action taken against Dr. Y. Thiruvavul, formerly Tutor in Radiology and now Civil Surgeon in Radiology. The Commission after examining the case with connected records suggested that the punishment of stoppage of increment for three years with cumulative effect may be imposed on the delinquent in relaxation of the codified punishment under FR18 (3) for his unauthorised absence from duty and communicated its views to the Government on 19.11.98. The Government have stated that the orders as advised by the Commission could not be issued in view of the orders of the Tamil Nadu Administrative Tribunal holding FR 18 (3) as invalid and based on above orders amendments to FR. 18 (3) were issued in G.O. Ms. No. 154, Personnel and Administrative

Reforms (FR III) Department, dated 8.8.2000. The Government have also stated that as the next annual increment for the delinquent falls on 1.10.2001 and also as he attains the age of superannuation on 31.8.2002, it will not be possible to impose the punishment as suggested by the Commission. Despite this they have also stated that as it would take some more time to get the Commission's revised views, the Government have decided to deviate from the views of the Commission and issued orders restricting the punishment of stoppage of increment for eleven months with cumulative effect in G.O. (D) No. 1394 Health and Family Welfare (II) Department, dated 26.9.2001.

THE FACTORS THAT PROMPTED THE GOVERNMENT TO ISSUE AN ORDER AGAINST THE ADVICE OF THE COMMISSION ARE DETAILED BELOW:-

Based on the advice of the Commission, the Government could not pass final orders in this case, in view of the orders of the Tamil Nadu Administrative Tribunal holding FR 18(3) as invalid. Based on the above orders of the Tribunal, Government have issued orders in G.O.Ms.No.154, P&AR (FRIII) Department, dated 8.8.2000, amending FR 18 (3). As the date of annual increment of Dr.Y. Thiruvarual was on 1.10.2001 and he attains the age of superannuation on 31.8.2002, it could not be possible to impose the punishment of stoppage of increment for 3 years with cumulative effect as suggested by the TNPSC since it could not be implemented. As it would take some more time to get the revised views of the Commission, the Government have decided to deviate from the views of the TNPSC and to restrict the punishment into stoppage of increment for eleven months with cumulative effect. Accordingly orders were issued in G.O. (D) No.1394, H&FW Department, dated 26.9.2001.

Case No.-IX

The Government in December '94 sought the views of the Commission on the disciplinary action initiated against two Assistant Executive Engineers(delinquent officer-1&2) in the Public Works Department for certain irregularities committed by them. The Commission pointed out certain defects in the procedure followed and the Government after rectifying the defects again sought the views of the Commission in respect of delinquent officer-2 alone in view of the fact that the other delinquent officer, Assistant Executive Engineer was removed from service for his unauthorised absence from duty. For the proven charge of delinquent officer-2, Assistant Executive Engineer, the Commission advised the Government to impose the punishment of stoppage of increment for 6 months without cumulative effect besides the recovery of 50% of the loss of Rs.25,112/- sustained to the Government from delinquent officer-2. Since the actual loss caused to the Government was intimated to the Commission subsequently as Rs.20,090/- the Commission expressed the view that besides the proportionate recovery of Rs.20,090/- the punishment of 'Censure' would meet the ends of justice as the delinquent officer-2 was due to retire from service on 31.3.2001. But Government considered that the punishment of 'Censure' is not appropriate and decided to deviate from the views of the Commission and to impose the punishment of cut in pension at the rate of Rs.200/- per month for a period of one year apart from recovery of loss i.e. Rs.8,802/- from the DCRG of the delinquent officer-2 and issued orders accordingly in G. O. (2D) No. 72, PWD (E1) dt. 9.11.2001.

THE FACTORS THAT PROMPTED THE GOVERNMENT TO ISSUE AN ORDER AGAINST THE ADVICE OF THE COMMISSION ARE DETAILED BELOW:-

The views of the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission were examined by the Public Works Department and was proposed as follows:-

"Censure appears to be a meaningless punishment at this stage. Hence, pension cut of Rs.200/- per month for one year may be awarded as punishment apart from the proportionate recovery of Rs.8,802/- out of

Rs.20,090/- from the Delinquent Officer after allowing him to retire from service on 31.3.2001 without prejudice to the disciplinary proceedings".

Orders were issued in G.O.(D) No.93, Public Works, dated 31.3.2001 permitting Thiru C. Thirunavukkarasu, Assistant Executive Engineer to retire from service on attaining the age of superannuation on 31.3.2001 without prejudice to the disciplinary proceedings pending against him. A show cause notice was issued to C. Thirunavukkarasu, assistant Executive Engineer (conditionally retired) asking him to specifically state as to whether he accepted the punishment of cut of Rs.200/- per month from his pension for a period of one year, besides the recovery of Rs.8,802/- from his death-cum- retirement gratuity or not. The Delinquent Officer had replied in the affirmative.

Accordingly, final orders were issued in G.O. (2D) No.72, Public Works, dated 9.11.2001 imposing the following punishments on Thiru C. Thirunavukkarasu, AEE (conditionally retired on 31.3.2002):-

- (i) A cut of Rs.200/- (Rupees two hundred only) from his pension for a period of one year
- (ii) A recovery of Rs.8,802/- (being the proportionate amount of actual loss of Rs.20,090/-) from his Death -cum- Retirement Gratuity
