 - (c) 'C' with the intention of causing the death of a child of tender years, exposes it in a desert place. Whether 'C' has committed any offence?
 - (d) 'A' makes a false entry in his shop-book for the purpose of using it as corroborative evidence in a court. What offence 'A' has committed?
 - (e) 'A' finds a ring lying on the high road, not in the possession of any person and he takes it. Is 'A' guilty of any offence?

7. **Answer the following giving Sections of Law : (any SEVEN)** (35)
- (a) 'A', a carrier, is entrusted by Z with property to be carried by land or by water. 'A' dishonestly misappropriates the property. What offence 'A' has committed?
 - (b) 'B' commits house-trespass by creeping into a ship of a port-hole between decks. Has 'B' committed any offence?
 - (c) 'C' a soldier, fires on a mob by the order of his superior officer, in conformity with the commands of the law. Has 'C' committed any offence?
 - (d) 'A' knows 'B' to be behind a bush. 'C' does not know it. 'A' intending to cause B's death, induces 'C' to fire at the bush. 'C' fires and kills 'B'. What offence 'A' has committed?

- (e) 'B' introduces water into an ice-house belonging to 'A' and thus causes the ice to melt, intending wrongful loss to 'A'. Is 'B' guilty of any offence?
- (f) 'A', being legally bound to appear before a High Court, in obedience to a subpoena issuing from that court, intentionally omits to appear. What offence 'A' has committed?
- (g) 'A', in India, instigates B, a foreigner in country 'X', to commit a murder in that country. Is 'A' guilty of any offence?
- (h) 'B' forcibly carries or entices 'C' away from his home in order that 'C' may be murdered. What offence 'B' has committed?
- (i) 'A' sits dharna at C's door with intention of causing it to be believed that, by so sitting, he renders 'C' an object of divine displeasure. Is 'A' guilty of any offence?
- (j) 'A' begins to unloose the muzzle of a ferocious dog, intending or knowing it to be likely that he may thereby cause 'Z' to believe that he is about to cause the dog to attack Z. Has 'A' committed any offence?
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
